

# A Church at the Centre

The present day Saint David's Church stands on the site of a 14th century Church which was radically restored in 1867 and later the chancel was extended in 1910. It is situated in the River Lugg valley with a beautiful outlook from the porch across the river valley to Litton Hill beyond. During the early spring and summer the Churchyard is a blaze of colour with snowdrops, crocuses, wood daffodils, narcissi and finally bluebells taking turns at showing their colours and then wild flowers and grasses until the bulbs have gone back to sleep. Also in the churchyard we have the grave of the world's longest serving headmaster, D.R. Davies, who was head of Whitton School until his death, aged 92. The record appears in the Guinness Book of Records and is unlikely to ever be surpassed.

The parish undertook a fundraising project in 1990 to renew the roof of the Church and fortunately the Church still remains in a good state of repair with only minor upkeep.

Looking back through Church registers our congregation nowadays is much greater than it was in the 1950's and 60's, but the largest attendances were during the 1980's when several young families were involved in the life of the Church and we had a thriving Sunday Club, but we have

all grown older and the children have grown up and moved away. However today we have a steady number of members from the surrounding area but unfortunately no young children, and consequently the village school closed 12 months ago. The school is a sad loss to the community and to the Church as they held 2-3 school services here during the year.

Whitton Church is situated close to both Pilleth and Cascob Churches, all in rural areas with a low population and so fund raising opportunities for the Churches is limited, but the members of each Church are very supportive of each other's services and fundraising events.

The congregation at Whitton is welcoming and over the past couple of years we have been pleased to greet several new worshippers who have moved into the locality. Also we have been pleased to welcome new faces to the pulpit as we move forward as a new ministry area. In fact Whitton Church is placed at the centre of the new area halfway between Colva and Beguildy, and it seemed like the centre of the universe when a full Church welcomed Bishop John to inaugurate the group on January 8th. 





# FARM FOCUS: Cwmwhitton Farm, Whitton



Cwmwhitton Farm has belonged to the Pugh family since 1914 and Colin Pugh's grandfather, Verney Pugh, bought it in 1922. Colin married Phyllis who lived near Colva and they have worked

together on the farm ever since. They recently handed over the management of the farm to their son, Gareth.

Cwmwhitton stretches from Whitton to Norton and is famous in the area for the quality of its premium Belana potatoes. Colin says they've enjoyed growing potatoes for 50 years and says: "The Belana potatoes are the best tasting potatoes that we have ever grown!" Phyllis told me that their potatoes are superb for boiling, mashing, roasting and chipping. The quality must be good because

Cwmwhitton supply about 1,000 tonnes of seed potatoes to merchants across the UK.

Potatoes only occupy 70 acres of Cwmwhitton. The Pughs manage a large cereal crop which provides feed and bedding for their livestock. With at least 1,000 ewes and 140 Saler sucker cows, they will be busy again with lambing and calving next month Their lamb is sold at Ludlow market and you'll find their beef at Aldi.

Like other farmers in our area, the Pughs face an uncertain future on support payments and increasing costs of production. Colin is treasurer of the local NFU and St David's Whitton and counts money in lambs. "In 1970", he tells me, "a tractor cost 200 lambs and today its 700 lambs". That's lamb expensive!



One of Mrs Vale's long term employers had advertised for a housekeeper with a daughter (not allowed today), because he had only sons. Together Jean and the kindly employer listened to both *Friday Night is Music Night* and to classical music on his gramophone. They formed a close bond for years, and he gave her away at her wedding.



#### **Our Celtic Valentine**

St Dwynwen is our Welsh version of St Valentine. Her feast day is the 25th January, close enough to February. She lived in the 5th century and was reputedly

St Dwynwen's story

one of the prettiest of Brychan Brycheiniog's 24 daughters. She fell in love with a prince called Maelon Dafodrill. When he tried to seduce her she prayed that God would make her forget Maelon. An angel visited her carrying a sweet potion designed to erase all memory of Maelon and turn him into a block of ice.

God then granted her three wishes: first that Maelon be thawed; second that God meet the hopes and dreams of true lovers; and third, that she should never marry. All three were fulfilled, and as a mark of her thanks, Dwynwen devoted herself to God's service for the rest of her life.

She founded a convent on Llanddwyn, off the west coast of Anglesey, where a well named after her became a place of pilgrimage. Visitors believed that the sacred fish or eels that lived in the well could foretell whether or not their relationship would be happy.

T o celebrate St Dwynwen or St Valentine give a lovespoon! The earliest surviving Welsh lovespoon is from 1667 and is kept at St Fagans Museum. They are still used today to celebrate births, weddings, anniversaries. They are carved with many symbols:

Bell – weddings, anniversaries Ball(s) in cage – number of children Cross – faith Diamond – wealth, good fortune

Heart – Love

Horseshoe – good luck

Key/Keyhole – security, home

Knot/Celtic knotwork – everlasting, together forever

Dragon – Protection, symbol of Wales






# **COUGHS & SNEEZES**

So you can sit in front of a blazing fire, sniffing into a tissue and think about the patron saint of sore throats.





#### Twenty Years of Women

his first issue of The Radnor comes at a time when we look back on 20 years of the ordination of women to the priesthood in the Church in Wales. There were celebrations in all six Dioceses in Wales on Saturday 7th January. In Brecon Cathedral, the preacher was the Bishops' Officer for Church and Society, Revd. Canon Carol Wardman. The Bishop presided at the Eucharist.

In her address, Canon Carol said the fact that the anniversary coincided with the feast of the Epiphany was particularly appropriate.

"The Epiphany is the demonstration or manifestation of Jesus to the Gentiles, in other words to the whole world. And that was an idea at least as revolutionary as the ordination of women to the priesthood has been."\*

This celebration came just weeks before the consecration of Canon Joanna Penberthy (from Holy Trinity in Llandrindod Wells) as the Bishop of St. David's and the retirement of Archbishop Barry Morgan, who will oversee her consecration.

God has constantly renewed his church throughout the centuries. Whether lay or ordained, we are all privileged to be a part of the Body of Christ in our area, at this time.






