St. Cynllo's - On the edge . . . but not apart

Llangunllo is the first settlement downstream of Beacon Hill, source of the River Lugg. Its church, St Cynllo's, sits high on a prominant mound in the village centre, commanding views of the village, valley and farms in the parish.

St Cynllo's is a surprisingly spacious and well-appointed church, and not nearly as Victorian as might be expected, as it was given a make-over in 19th Century Early English style by the eminent architect, John Middleton of York, in 1878. It was rebuilt on a mediaeval wall footing, and churches have existed on this site for well over 1,000 years. Surrounded by an ancient and full churchyard, it nowadays makes use of a cemetery on the facing hillside. Back in 1140 Llangunllo was seen as providing a mother church to the neighbouring "chapels" of Whitton and Heyope.

At one time there were twelve churches dedicated to St. Cynllo in Radnorshire, but this has shrunk to four, and he remains an elusive figure. He may well have been of noble birth and princely descent, and probably spent time as a monk. Some early documents say he was the brother of St. Teilo who lived around 500-560 A.D. and gave his name to Llandeilo.

There is only one memorial tablet in the chancel: it commemorates John Thomas Jackson of Treburvaugh, who was born in 1841 and died in 1925, and was the High Sheriff of Radnorshire in 1902. His family also kindly donated the Village Hall. All other inscriptions were moved to the West end of the church during the rebuild. The doorway to the vestry is through a fifteenth century arch, and the belfry has four bells, only three of which are now "donged" before each service.



Dear Friends,

The supermarket shelves are creaking under the weight of the chocolate eggs, and our Lenten preparation is well underway. The events of Palm Sunday and Holy Week are only weeks away. If we travel with Jesus and his disciples through those eight days from Palm Sunday to Easter Sunday, we will expose ourselves to the full range of human emotions.

The celebration of Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem is short lived; we know what lies ahead. Entering the city astride a donkey, announcing a unique, new form of kingship, we recall that within the week he is wearing a crown of thorns.



The cries of 'Hosanna! Hosanna!', soon give way to 'Crucify him! Crucify him!' The events at the last supper, memorialised at every communion service we attend, are never more poignant than on Maundy Thursday. Then after the meal, as Jesus offers comfort to his distressed disciples, saying 'Do not let your hearts be troubled, trust in God, trust also in me', we remember that later that same night Jesus himself will be in anguish in the garden of Gethsemane, seeking comfort from his Father.

Then comes Friday and the cross, and the hatred and the loss. Our sins have placed him there and held him there. All is desolation and despair, and yet, **and yet!**

Then comes Easter day. Hope is reborn, we have been redeemed, our sins have been forgiven.

Christ Is Risen.

All is joy, but only because of the grief that has gone before. The richness of the experience emerges from the starkness of the contrast. Good Friday and Easter Sunday must be inextricably linked in our hearts and minds. This Eastertide embrace both the agony and the ecstasy as we walk the journey of Holy Week together.


About the Cover

The Resurrection: The fine Easter window on the cover is placed next to the pulpit at St Michael's, Beguildy. It reveals Christ emerging triumphant from the tomb. He is dressed in red for martyrdom and white for saintliness. He holds a cross-like staff with the Christian flag near the top. His feet bear the marks of the nails.

Below the resurrection image are the two Roman soldiers sleeping during the momentous event.

The window was dedicated to the grandparents of Edward Harris, Edward and Margaret Harris of Pantycaragle on 14th October 1950.

We know St David was called, but to what are we called? She spoke of Jeremiah's call, when he complained that he was too young to be a prophet. But he, like St David, responded anyway.


We sang our Welsh hymns celebrating him with gusto.

The Village Quire has a reputation for spinetingling harmony singing. Malk Williams is a professional voice artist, actor, storyteller and wearer of flamboyant headgear.


















St David's Day at New Radnor





Our Stories

What Llangunllo Was Like in 1696

An invaluable 'snapshot' of the parish in 1696 or 1697 was recorded by the indefatigable Edward Lhwyd, who spent years touring Wales, knapsack on back, collecting information for a 'Geographical History' which was never published.

In Llangunllo, his anonymous local informants told him, there was a vicarage and 'about' 6 houses in the village, plus two hamlets, one 'above' and one 'below' the church. The parish feast day, then as now, was held on 17 July, St Cynllo's Day. 'Seats of the gentry' in the parish and their owners were Weston (Mr.Thomas Holland); 'Bryngoed' ('Mr. Vaughan, priest'); 'Keven Sweren' – Cefnsuran (Mr. William Chambers); 'Lhwyn coch' – Llancoch (Mr. Robert James); and Lea Hall (Mr. Evan Williams). Dolyfan is described as a former (rabbit) warren belonging to Sir Standish Herston.

Natural features noted included 'Hengen mountain' (Beacon Hill?); the river Lugg, rising at 'Cwm Llugw' near 'Pont y Phrwyd' and flowing through the parish; and the

'Nant y Phrwd' brook 'which hath a great fall over a great rock called Craig y ffrwd [now Water-break-its neck?] and falls into the Lugg.'

Lhwyd's Llangunllo contacts provided their information partly in English and partly in a local form of Welsh. But the accounts of the Llangunllo churchwardens and 'overseers of the poor', which begin in 1693 and are thus among the earliest in Wales, are from the beginning entirely in English (albeit sometimes 'Radnorshire English').

1938: "Now comes a rapid descent to the upper Lugg valley; from half-way down you catch sight of a largish village—Llangunllo—which from this point looks truly attractive. The charm of Llangunllo by no means vanishes on a closer view, but rather is enhanced by the high average of comeliness among its children and young women." [Still true today, of course!]

6th April - Saint Brychan Brycheiniog (5th C)

Once upon a time, there was a king named Brychan. This was before St Patrick went to Ireland. Brychan's father was an Irish king and his mother, Marchell, heiress to the Welsh kingdom of Garthmadrun.

After many adventures, Brychan himself became king of Garthmadrun, which was renamed Brycheiniog (Brecon) in his honour. The royal residence may have been the crannog on Llangorse Lake. Brychan did lots of kingly things, like fighting wars, but he also became a Christian and was honoured as a saint. It seems he had an extraordinary number of children, traditionally 11 sons and 24 daughters, but according to the lists from other Celtic countries, there were many more. He had five wives, not all at the same time of course, but if these were all truly his children, some of the wives must have overlapped. Alternatively this could be a memory of a Christian community, led by Brychan, the Christian king, who taught the young people to be missionaries.

Be that as it may, many of these "children" of Brychan journeyed to Cornwall and Brittany, taking the Gospel with them and founding churches.



Lemon Crunch Cake Recipe

6 oz butter Topping:

6 oz soft brown sugar
2 eggs

Juice of 1 lemon
4 oz caster sugar

6 oz self-raising flour

Preheat oven to 350°F 175°C (160°C fan) gas mark 4.

Melt butter in saucepan and dissolve the brown sugar in it. Don't boil. Add beaten eggs and flour. Line a Swiss roll tin. Bake for 15-20 minutes. Stir lemon juice into caster sugar and pour over cake whilst it is still hot. Allow cake to cool and turn out, cut into slices.



Two Funerals

Fresh flowers decorated the Church as a lovely reflection of Joyce's love of flowers and the garden.

Caring for God's Acre

Under the Caring for God's Acre scheme, we now have bird and bat boxes in the Churchyard, all expertly made by The Men's Shed. A group of us, under the expert supervision of Leigh Harling-Bowen, spent a Saturday morning putting these up. Do take a look if you are in the
