St Mary's Pilleth

Standing on the slopes of Bryn Glas Hill. It watches over the beautiful Lugg valley and is a typical Celtic site, remote, wild, with a Holy Well behind the church.

St. Mary's has had a turbulent past. It was first burned in 1403 during the iconic Battle of Pilleth, the last major Welsh victory over the English, when Owen Glyndwr defeated the English under Edmond Mortimer.

St. Mary's was burned again at the end of the 19th century when a newly installed heater caught fire. Some years later a local benefactor commissioned architect, Sir Walter Tapper, to restore it. The stone steps are part of his work. However the money ran out before the roof could be renewed, leaving a temporary roof for the next 100 years! By the end of the last century, the roof and much of the structure was in dire straits. A 75% grant from the Welsh Lottery Fund and a lot of hard work from the local community followed. The restoration was completed and the church rededicated on 23rd May 2004.

Simon Jenkins writes in his forward to England's 1000 Best Churches, "I see my churches as bonds that have brought . . . us together in village and town through a thousand years of history. They are memories in stone. . . It is through (our) churches that we learn who we were and thus who we are and might become. Lose that learning and we lose the collective memory that is the essence of human society."


Do come to support and cheer on those taking this important step of faith.

Easter has come and gone – or has it? What does Easter mean for you once the day, or the Easter weekend has passed? Do you keep, or recycle your lovely Easter cards?

Easter cards don't change much – crosses and churches, but also daffodils, lambs and chicks – symbols of new life and all those lovely things we enjoy about Spring.

The Ascension: This fine window at St Michael's Beguildy is a companion window to last month's picture of the Resurrection.

The Ascension of Jesus occurs forty days after his Resurrection, so it is fitting that the two should stand side-by-side next to the pulpit. Christ is again dressed in red for martyrdom with a white cloak edged in gold for saintliness and kingship. His hands are lifted in blessing to the disciples gazing on below as he ascends to heaven. He has just given them the charge to go into all the world with the gospel message. The window was dedicated along with several others on 14th October 1950.

Ascension Day this year is on Thursday, 25th May. It is traditionally a time when village wells have been decorated and blessed. Our Minisry Area Service is at 10.30am at St Edward's, Knighton.

Saint of the Month - Brendan of Clonfert (or the Navigator) - 16th May

Tf ever you are in the west of Ireland you must visit the Dingle Peninsula. Take a day's trip around the coast and you will see not only amazing scenery, but also fascinating remains of early Christian monastic communities. Brendan was contemporary with David and Columba and he is the third patron saint of Ireland, after Patrick and Brigit. He was born in County Kerry and he founded a number of monastic settlements in that area, but nowadays he is most famous for his mythical voyage, which is why he is also known as Brendan the Navigator. If you have time, climb Mount Brandon (Brandon is another spelling of Brendan) from where you will see an expansive view over the Atlantic Ocean. Like Brendan you will be able to imagine other lands lying out there beyond the horizon. Below on the coast is Brandon Creek, from where he would have set out in his curragh.

"The Voyage of Saint Brendan", written in the 9th century, is a fascinating account of Brendan's search for the Land of Promise, encountering marvellous islands on the way. This account is more allegorical than factual, though some of the descriptions are recognisable as perhaps the Faroes, Iceland etc. If you want to read a

modern interpretation, C.S. Lewis's "Voyage of the Dawn Treader", one of the Narnia books, is based on the Voyage of Brendan.

The illustration is a 15th century woodcut showing Brendan encountering an island that turned out to be a sea monster.

Then Hannah paid the price of God granting her a son, Samuel, by giving him back to serve the church. Solomon judged between two mothers, each claiming the same baby. Threatening to cut it in half, Solomon knew the real mother would be prepared to let the child go rather than have that happen.

We paused for thought during a moving song about an evacuee child. Then more imagined words from a mother – this time waiting for the train to return at the end of the war bringing her little girl home; two sisters rushed forward from the back of the church into their mother's enveloping arms, making it all very real.

The joyful mood was echoed by the blessing and distribution of posies and a rousing hymn.

Refreshments followed and a chance to catch up with news. Many remarked how lucky we are not to have to face such harrowing decisions.



Imagine playing in an orchestra just for the fun of it! Not to perform, just to get together every week and play music you love. That is the case for the New Titley Philharmonic Orchestra. They enjoy exploring music from the 17th and 18th centuries.

For only the third time in ten years this small baroque orchestra performed, treating a good audience at Bleddfa to a lovely production of Pergolesi's (1710-1736) *Stabat Mater*. Fittingly they came during Holy Week.

Farm Focus: The Greening of Home Farm

Home Farm, Norton has been home to the Lloyd family since Tony and David Lloyd's grandfather bought the farm in 1923. Home Farm is well-known in the area for hosting the Norton Show on the farm every August. It is a mixed farm with about 300 Suffolk Cross ewes, 50 cows and arable crops of wheat and barley.

Tony Lloyd is always a smiling and cheery farmer and well-respected in the area. Tony told me that lambing in February had gone quite well with about 1.75 lambs per ewe, about 470 lambs in all. He says that they have to manage typical lamb birthing complications such as two legs being presented but no head; so he has to get stuck in "to get the head round". The younger ewes (hoggets) are less experienced and sometimes get frightened during the birth process and run off so Tony and his colleagues are very watchful. Once lambs are born they iodise the lambs' navels and place them in pens with their mother.

In June Tony will take the lambs to market at Builth or Rhayader and then a livestock dealer like Peter Badger will buy on behalf of retailers. Tony along with his niece, Katie, and brother, David, have developed a new business in biomass wood pellets, which is compressed ground sawdust. They import the pellets and supply them to customers with biomass boilers as a biofuel, either on the lorry which is blown in to a silo at the customers premises, or in small bags. They also supply wood pellets for animal bedding, primarily horses. All you need is 7 or 8 bags of pellets and add water and it turns in to wonderful horse bedding, with so many benefits. "The horses love it, as do the owners, it's so easy to muck out! It's proving to be very popular," he says. They are highly absorbent, and the production process involves very high temperatures, therefore meaning any bacteria are killed. Plus it is 100% organic and environmentally friendly, as well as being more cost effective in many cases than the existing bedding methods. With three biomass driers of their own, they no longer need oil and can run the farm workshops, two houses and a log drying kiln all on biomass fuels.

When Jesus was arrested Peter denied ever knowing him. The rest of the apostles were noteworthy for their absence, and so Mark concluded the service by blowing out each candle one-by-one . . . each friend.

Tark Beaton led us in a Good Friday evening service f I of lamentation from the Iona community. That may sound like heavy weather but it was actually a simple service of hope.


We read about the prophet Jeremiah who bought a field in the very year that the Israelites were conquered and







Bara Brith (like you've never made it before)

1 cup of All Bran 1 egg

3/4 cup caster sugar $1\frac{1}{2}$ oz margarine

1 cup milk $1\frac{1}{2}$ cups self-raising flour

1 cup mixed dried fruit

Preheat oven to $350^{\circ}F$, $180^{\circ}C$ ($160^{\circ}C$ Fan), gas mark 4.

Soak All Bran, sugar, milk, and dried fruit together for at least 1 hour, the longer the better, to allow the fruit to plump up. Rub fat into flour, add egg and the soaked ingredients. Place in a 2 lb loaf tin and bake for $1\frac{1}{2}$ hours.

Note: If you don't have a measuring cup, just use any average size cup.

Why do we need an ME Awareness Month/Week/Day?

Lexpect most of you will know at least one person with ME. You may even have a sufferer in your family. It is quite a common disease, but it is still not known how it is caused or how best to treat it. Research is poorly funded and there are many misconceptions, which is why we need an Awareness Month. Twenty five years ago 12th May was designated as International Awareness Day. This was



the birthday of Florence Nightingale, who was largely bedridden for the last 40 years of her life with an ME-like illness. In the UK the ME Association has designated the second week of May as ME Awareness Week. This year it is 8th to 14th May and people are "Going Blue for ME". Action for ME has extended the week to a month and, as well as fundraising, uses the

opportunity to raise awareness of the disease by reporting

real-life stories in the local press and on news websites. Look out for them.

Here are some of the most common symptoms:

- Severe fatigue and malaise following mental or physical activity, often manifesting itself a day or two later. Muscle pain and twitching.
- Problems with short-term memory, concentration, clumsiness, disequilibrium and word finding abilities.
- Flu-like symptoms, headaches, sore throats, joint pains.
- Sleep disturbances either too much or too little.
- Emotional lability, mood swings.
- etc.

Children Express the Emotions of Easter



The 'Open the Book' team got their creative juices going for children from Knighton School who arrived at St Edward's for Easter Experience.

Palm Sunday - Hopes and Dreams

The children waved palm branches like the early Israelites and thought about their own hopes and dreams, sometimes a puppy or peace in our world. They drew their hopes on polished stones, which they placed at the foot of the cross.

Foot Washing - Servant King

As they thought about Jesus washing his disciples' feet, they reflected on how they too might serve others: running errands for a disabled relative, sending a Get Well card, befriending someone who was unhappy at school. They reverently dipped a finger in water and marked their hands with a cross.

Last Supper – Remember Me

Children gathered around a white table and thought about their poignant memories: a grandmother's locket, a photograph of a deceased relative, a football trophy.

Garden of Gethsemane - Alone

A lovely little garden greeted them at the next station where they considered how lonely Jesus must have felt. They modelled in clay images of their alone times: when

a pet or a relative had died, when others were nasty in the playground.

Crucifixion – Sharing our Sorrows

Children gathered at a large cross to consider sadness and suffering. Each held a red ribbon tied to the cross and said their own private prayer for refugees, the homeless, the hungry, someone special.

The Empty Tomb – Jesus is Alive!

The Open the Book team re-enacted Mary discovering the tomb empty, rushing to the disciples, and her joyful encounter with Jesus. Melia noted that every time they break open an Easter egg, it is like breaking open the tomb.

The children were a tribute to the school and to their parents, as they caught the mood, reflected deeply, and responded with a quiet honesty.
