St. Peter's, Evancoyd - The Elegant Legacy

The elegant Victorian Gothic Church of St Peter's Evancoyd with its tall spire, stands on a hill overlooking Evenjobb. It was built between 1866 and 1870, commissioned by Robert Baskerville Rickards Mynors and his wife Ellen Gray Higgins (daughter of the Reverend Edward Higgins of Bosbury House, Ledbury) who lived at both Evancoyd Court and Treago in Herefordshire. Robert was educated at Eton and Oxford University and held the offices of High Sheriff and Deputy Lieutenant of Radnorshire. Robert and Mary were kind and generous philanthropists who also built the school at Evenjobb. They instructed Architect T.H. Wyatt (later President of R.I.B.A.) to design the Church.

It was constructed to a high standard, built in coursed grey sandstone with brown sandstone string moulding and window dressings. Indeed, St. Peter's represents a fine example of the best and most expensive materials of its time.

The Stained Glass

Beautiful stained glass windows made by Jones and Willis adorn the Church, throwing rainbow colours across the interior. To the left of the altar St. Peter is shown with the keys to heaven and opposite is Mary holding Jesus in her arms. This is a personal reference since Peter and Mary were the Christian names of Robert's mother and father. The main east end sanctuary window (in three panels) depicts Christus Victor with the Archangel St. Michael at his feet in the centre. On the left hand panel, women are preparing to anoint the body of Jesus and on the right hand, Peter and John are shown travelling to the tomb. Incidentally, the term "Christus Victor" refers to the belief that through his death and resurrection Jesus defeated all the powers of evil, thus gaining the victory.

Woodwork

Beneath this window, the carved oak reredos is guarded by small golden angels and mysteriously depicts a falling bird in the centre. It is dedicated in loving memory of Ellen Gray Mynors who died at Barland in 1910. Behind an older screen in the south aisle chapel, resides the quality Nicholson pipe organ which has a good sound and it is

hoped will one day be restored to its former glory, also a gift of the Mynors' family.

Welcoming

Today the Church of St. Peter is warm and friendly and we have a loyal group worshippers who meet three on Sundays each month. During the Summer the church is kept open and everyone is welcome to come and visit. Outside, sitting on a bench in the immaculately maintained

churchyard you can enjoy stunning views across the Radnor Valley to the ancient Iron Age Burfa Camp and beyond.

The Cover — Peter

The fine window from St Peter's Evancoyd shows Peter kneeling before the resurrected Jesus. He is being reconciled after having betrayed Jesus three times. Jesus asks him, "Do you love me". When Peter says "Yes" Jesus responds "Feed my sheep." He asks him the same question three times, and Peter affirms his love and loyalty three times.

It is the great commission to Peter to be a good shepherd of the church, feeding the sheep (the people) which are surrounding them. Jesus holds a shepherd's staff which bishops still carry today as a sign that they, like Peter, are commissioned to be shepherds.

Peter is regarded as the chief apostle, and traditionally counted as the first Bishop of Rome, the Pope. But originally he was a simple fisherman, named Simon, until renamed by Jesus as the "Rock" or "Petrus". He played a leadership role and was with Jesus during events witnessed by only a few apostles. He is usually portrayed as bearded, and interestingly in this image the artist shows him with hair cut in a tonsure, the sign of a monk.

Dear Friends,

June will soon be "Bustin' out all over" and the church will be celebrating its birthday. Pentecost, also known as Whitsun or Whit Sunday, on June 4th is when we remember God's gift of the Holy Spirit to those gathered in Jerusalem at the time of the Jewish festival of Shavu'ot, just ten days after Jesus had ascended into heaven. The giving of the Holy Spirit marks the launch of the Church; thus Pentecost is the Church's birthday.

Individual churches have their own anniversaries or 'birthdays', but of course the Church being the Church, these anniversaries have to be given a special name so they get called Patronal Festivals. Just one of our 14 churches has a Patronal Festival in June and that is St Peter's Evancoyd on June 29th.

Each patronal festival can be the focus for a local gathered community, but Pentecost is a birthday for all church communities of all denominations. At Pentecost we celebrate the birth of the Church but more importantly we celebrate and give thanks for the gift of the Holy Spirit, which every Christian since that first Pentecost has received at the moment when they have accepted Jesus as Lord.



Thank you St Cynllo's for all your hard work!



Tudor costume tends to be familiar as colourful clothing seen in paintings of the rich and royal. Val Tyler showed members of Gladestry WI at their April meeting, another side of Tudor life through the dress of the ordinary people.

Val's teenaged daughter spent her summer holidays as a volunteer at Kentwell Hall in Suffolk. As such she was required to wear the authentic costume of the time for the work she was doing whether in the kitchens or out in the gardens. Val researched this costume thoroughly in order to hand sew appropriate Tudor wear for her daughter.

The undergarment was slept in and never taken off.

Members were shown how a maid dressed, from underwear to outer clothing. Val described the problems the clothing caused the maids, and how they adapted the clothing to cope with wet weather, summer heat and winter cold. The maids only had the one outfit, which was never washed. The undergarment was slept in and never

taken off. As they grew out of their clothes, they were handed down to lesser servants, still unwashed.

Just like today, the girls shortened or lengthened the skirts, according to the current Tudor fashion. Colours were always dark blue but the outfit brightened by purple linings and colourful knitted socks.

Val built up the clothing on a dressmaker's form, so members could watch the development and understand. Members were held spellbound by Val's interesting information, and they had very many questions to ask which Val was delighted to answer!



17th June - St Nectan of Hartland

Do you remember Brychan Brycheiniog and all his children who went to be missionaries across the sea in Devon, Cornwall and Brittany? Well, according to the Cornish list of children, Nectan was his eldest son. Whether or not he was an actual child of Brychan, he sailed from South Wales in the mid 5th century, to see where God would take him. He landed on one of the most inhospitable parts of the Devon coast, at Hartland Point, where jagged rocks stretch out into the sea. It is said that the local inhabitants used to lure ships on to the rocks so that they could obtain smuggled goods. Fortunately Nectan was safe and he settled in a place now called Stoke in Hartland. The parish church, which is dedicated to him, is probably on the site of his original dwelling. His holy well is nearby.

He met a gruesome death on 17th June 510 AD. Nectan had two cows, given to him when he helped a swineherd

to find his lost pigs. Unfortunately some bandits stole the cows. Nectan tracked them down and tried to convert the robbers to Christianity, but they cut off his head. In accordance with Celtic myth and legend, Nectan picked up his head and carried it as far as his holv well, where he died. It is said that, wherever the drops of blood foxgloves sprang up, and it



is still a local tradition to place foxgloves on his well on 17 June.



Our Stories

Farm Focus: Lawn Farm, Dutlas

awn Farm near Dutlas is a traditional hill farm, 180 acres of which was rented by Philip Swancott's great grandfather, Thomas, in 1920. He shortly after purchased it, and five generations of Thomas – Philip – Thomas – Philip – Thomas have lived in the 15th Century Farmhouse ever since. Before the Reformation The Lawn housed monks from Abbey Cwm Hir; three generations of the Swancotts have been Beguildy Churchwardens.

In Philip's lifetime The Lawn has grown to 345 acres. The first trading name of this farming family was T Swancott and Sons, later P L Swancott & Son, now T A Swancott & Son. The pitch mark on his sheep has always been T S. Philip and Emma, helped by their children, Elizabeth and Thomas, keep over 900 sheep, suckler cows and store cattle. These days TB has made cattle rearing more

difficult. Philip's father also kept 50 Welsh mountain ponies on the Beacon.

Philip loves his flock of registered Beulah sheep, a fine multi-purpose breed which thrives at The Lawn. He can trace the bloodline to the 1970's, his is a 'closed flock'; he doesn't buy in females, only rams. At the Beulah Society sale in 2016 his yearling ewes made a record price.

He also keeps Welsh Ewes, which make good use of grazing rights on Beacon Hill; they're a 'hefted' flock (they know their territory). Crossed with a Blue Faced Leicester to breed Welsh mules, the remainder are crossed with Welsh Rams to breed flock replacements.

The Swancott family tend their sheep on the hills with traditional dogs and quad bikes. Philip likes nothing better than to be out with his sheep at the 'Pool' on the Beacon.



Preheat oven to 350°F, 180°C (160°C fan) gas mark 4.

Grease two baking sheets.

Mix oats, flour, and sugar together. Melt margarine and syrup, add soda dissolved in the boiling water. Add to the dry ingredients and mix well. Roll into small balls and place well apart on greased baking sheets. Bake approximately 15 minutes.





St RICHARD of CHICHESTER

St Richard of Chichester, who lived from 1197 to 1253, is patron saint of the English county of Sussex.

In 1244 Richard was elected Bishop of Chichester but King Henry III wanted someone else as bishop and he ordered that no one should feed or house Richard. So Richard lived with a friend who was a parish priest and visited his entire diocese on foot for two years until the king relented.

Richard is widely remembered today for the prayer he is supposed to have said as he was dying. The prayer was adapted for the song 'Day by Day' in the musical Godspell and it is in this form that most people know it today:




