

St Michael and All Angels's, Beguildy

When entering Beguildy on the B4355 from the Knighton direction, the most northerly church in the diocese, St Michael and All Angels, stands proudly above the village on the left. Built on a spur between the valley of the River Teme to the north and a small tributary valley to the south this grade 2* listed building and churchyard command extensive views across the surrounding countryside. West of the church the land rises steadily to Cefn Pawl more than 400m above sea level.

The church features a 14th century octagonal font reputed to carry marks made by Cromwell's troops sharpening their swords, a holy water stoup at the south door and a priest's door in the south wall near the choir stalls. A fine example of 15th century workmanship can be seen in the rood screen and loft coving which bears some original coloured Tudor roses and our own green man. The dug out parish chest hewn from a solid block of timber is an ancient churchwarden's chest possibly dating from the 13th century. One part of the chest would have been used for the church valuables and the other for the churchwarden's treasures. At the end of the chest was an iron ring for use when it was drawn by a horse to be buried or hidden in times of trouble.


Adding to the internal beauty of St Michael's is an almost full set of 20th century stained glass windows.

The date of the earliest church on this site is unknown but the present building is thought to be mainly 14th century with some 15th century fittings. There is, however, much uncertainty. Some of the walls and the priest's door are considered to be of the late 15th century, the windows early 15th century type. The chancel was rebuilt in 1885, the nave with south porch and screen in 1895/96. During the 19th century the original bell tower collapsed and the 3 bells dating from 1661 - 1664 were taken down and rehung forty years later in their present position in 1936 when the new bell cote was built.

St Michael's serves a scattered community along the upper Teme valley encompassing mainly the villages of Felindre, Beguildy and Dutlas. Whilst regular church attendance is dwindling at our two services each month the local community is supportive in other ways. Fund raising events which provide an opportunity for local people to come together are generally well supported and a number of the same people assist in church cleaning, providing flowers and mowing/maintaining the

churchyard. We are always delighted to see new faces and extend a very warm welcome to everyone for our Ministry Area Holy Communion service on the 29th October.

Dear Friends,

For lack of wood the fire goes out.....

On a wet, cold evening, I stepped into a home glowing with warmth from the wood burner in the living room. It provided a soothing, comforting atmosphere on what was a sad visit, following a bereavement. No doubt the atmosphere helped the family to relax as they shared stories of one they have loved.

I was reminded of the words above, which come from the infrequently read book of Proverbs in the Old Testament. Rather than intending to soothe us, they challenge us. The quote continues: and where there is no whisperer, quarrelling ceases.... The words of a whisperer are like delicious morsels....

Whisperer is an alternative name for a gossip. We may not think of ourselves as gossipers, but how easy it is to make and listen to innuendos about others that have power to stick and to form opinion. The Bible has strong words to say about what we say – the letter of James describes the tongue as a fire which has destructive power (seen at its most catastrophic in the Grenfell Tower tragedy). Let's take care with our words, that they may build others up, rather than tear them down.

The Cover — St Francis

The image of St Francis is from little Brinsop Church near Hereford. Francis is one of the best loved saints in the church. He is the patron saint of animals and the natural environment. In one legend shown in this window he stops on this travels to preach to his "sister birds". They flock to him; none flew away. In another tale he made peace between a marauding wolf and frightened villagers who promised to feed the wolf.

In both the Catholic and Anglican church animals are blessed on his feast day, 4th October. He had a great love for the natural world and spoke of "Brother Sun and Sister Moon". He is credited with holding the first outdoor nativity service with live animals – a moving, simple service where the cradle became the altar.

He founded several holy orders and lived in poverty as shown by his tonsure, his coarse, brown garment and bare feet.

In 1224 he received the stigmata (the marks of Christi's wounds) during the apparition of angels in a religious ecstasy. He was the first recorded person in Christian history to bear the wounds of Christ's Passion.

































Forty Years at the Shop!

Saint of the Month

Kenneth of Aghaboe - 11th October

I'm sure you have heard of St Columba of Iona. Well, one of his closest friends was St Kenneth (or Cainnech in Gaelic). Kenneth was born in Derry in about 520. His father was a bard but was rather poor, so Kenneth became a cowherd as a young boy. Later he began his studies, first at Clonard and then at Glasnevin where Columba was a fellow student. When the yellow plague came the students fled. Columba went to Derry, where he founded his first community and Kenneth went to Wales to study under St Cadoc at Llancarfan.

There are many ancient monastic and ecclesiastical sites in Ireland and Scotland attributed to Kenneth. His name is most closely associated with Aghaboe, where eventually a great cathedral was built, now unfortunately in ruins. In Scotland there is an island close to Iona called Inch Kenneth, and one of the oldest churches on Iona was also dedicated to him. Kenneth and Columba were so close that they seem to have had a telepathic relationship and knew when the other was in urgent need of prayer. Columba took Kenneth with him when they went to visit

Brude, the king of the Picts. We think that Kenneth, unlike Columba, could speak Pictish and so was a great help opening the way to the evangelisation of the Picts. In old

age he returned to Aghaboe and died around 600. He is known as one of the Twelve Apostles of Ireland.



The weather has seemed to be somewhat extreme, ranging from very hot to very wet, windy too, at times. But we cannot compare it with what the south-eastern U.S.


and the Caribbean islands have had to suffer, with parts of the Indian sub-continent faring even worse.

Recipe - Upside-Down Pear Cake

This sticky. caramel pear cake is just the thing for a cold winter's night. It is best served warm rather than hot, so that the delicate flavour of the pears really comes through.

Makes a single layer cake. You will need 1 x deep, round cake tin, 20 cm diameter, fully lined.

Ingredients:

Caramel pears base:

100q/3oz caster or granulated sugar 15g/½oz unsalted butter 4-5 pears

Sponge:

200g/7oz peeled and cored pears 2 tsp vanilla extract 200 g/7oz plain flour 50g/2oz ground almonds 2½ tsp baking powder ¼ tsp salt 120g/4oz unsalted butter

 $100 g/3 \frac{1}{2}$ oz light muscovado sugar 2 eggs

Method:

For the caramel pears base, pour the sugar into a saucepan so that it covers the base in an even tier and put over a medium heat. Only when the sugar has almost all melted should you stir the contents until it is a uniform, golden brown liquid. Take the pan off

the heat, stir in the butter until it has melted, then pour into the prepared tin to cover the base evenly. Leave to cool. Preheat the oven to 180° C/ 350° F/gas mark 4. Peel, core and halve the pears and lay cut side down on the caramel, top end inwards so that they form a nice circular pattern and cover the base or the tin.

For the sponge, blend the pears and vanilla extract into a purée, using a stick blender if possible and set aside. Mix the flour with the ground almonds, baking powder and salt and set aside. Cream the butter and sugar together, then beat in the eggs, followed by the puréed pears. Finally sift In the dry ingredients and beat until incorporated. Pour the mixture into the tin and spread over the pears, levelling off the top. Bake for 15-55 minutes, until a skewer comes out clean, then remove from the oven and leave to cool in the tin for 15 minutes.

To Serve: Turn out on to a serving plate (leave to cool further if necessary) and peel off the baking paper. Serve warm, perhaps with a drizzle of cream.



Flora and Fauna

Ripening fruits, lots of berries, yellowing leaves, all herald the beginning of autumn. It is a season for the chrysanthemum, together with dahlias, michaelmas daisies and late flowering clematis, many in rich burnished shades of copper, orange, rust, red, with contrasting blue and purple, so many shapes and textures. The dahlia continues to be in vogue, especially now that British local grown flowers are being promoted, with several growers already in business. A lot of our readers will remember the late Jim Bounds and his magnificent garden, full of amazing colour, dahlias in every shape and colour, large spiky ones like exploding fireworks down to the small pom pom type in lollipop colours. Many of the new type seem to be of the anemone variety, with lovely names like 'Total Tangerine', 'Waltzing Matilda' and 'Happy Single Wink'. If you want to grow a giant type measuring 25 cm (10 inches) across, have a look at one called 'Otto's Thrill' in rose pink.

As the heat of summer gradually gives way to lower temperatures the garden and countryside begins to change. Green leaves are replaced by the more flamboyant hues of brown, yellow, tangerine, red and cream. The

horse chestnut tree is producing satin-smooth brown conkers, a reminder of childhood pleasures.

Each season provides its own magic in the garden. October is a busy month, lots of tidying and staking caused by wind; perennials that have outgrown their space need dividing; annuals no longer looking their best need removing; spring bulbs like snowdrop, crocus and miniature daffs need to be planted. Lots of garden magazines have good offers at this time.

The house martins and swallows are lining up on the wires ready for the long flight to pastures new. We are sad to see them leave and pray they will return in 2018. Richard and Vera Wood loved the little birds and were very knowledgeable on their breeds and habits and always monitored the date they left this country and the date they returned.

God's creation and harvest will be celebrated in churches everywhere at this time of year. Exquisite, creative displays will be arranged for us to admire and appreciate.

The Iron Age Carnyx Sounded for Knucklas 17

John Kenny transfixed an audience at the Presteigne Assembly Rooms by playing a replica of the Iron Age Carnyx found by archaeologists in the Moray Firth. He demonstrated several such ancient, simple instruments – conch shell, didgeridoo, sackbut, alphorn – which led to the trombone. All are instruments without keys, frets, only a tube and the human mouth used as a reed. He brought two other carnyces: a French one with extraordinary head, and an Irish one, which could be either a half circle or an S shape. John certainly knew how to make the most extraordinary sounds emerge.

At high noon the next day John Kenny opened Knucklas 17 by blowing a conch shell at the top of Castle Hill. He led a procession down Castle Hill playing the mighty Iron Age Carynx.

Two large tents decorated with Iron Age scenes (shown here) and numerous small stands with local artisans and food stalls greeted the gathering. Ancient crafts were demonstrated: a simple lathe and shavehorse for turning wood, a kick wheel for pottery, drop spindles and loom for weaving, and a coracle. We could add to a cave painting and listen to ancient Celtic stories. A horse trailer was transformed to a mini-cinema the Heart of Wales train line. Simon Ayres of Cambrian Wildwood explained how tree and grass management using Tarpan, a pre-historic horse, and wild cattle could transform a one grass meadow to a

more natural site for the benefit of wildlife, flora, farmers and us.



The Wildlife Trust gave information on beaver introduction and a fascinating botanical walk to the top of the hill to learn grasses and flowers still lingering at the end of the summer: ladies bedstraw, yarrow, germander speedwell with its 'cowboy trousers'. Ric Morris brought his extensive collection of bones, from red deer to tiny weasels.

The energetic amongst us followed signs for the Camelot Café to the very top of Castle Hill with tables and chairs scattered around the high meadow for superb views of the Teme Valley. The Festival continued into the evening with lights strung around the tents, a bonfire, barbecue, drinks and varied performances in the main tent: hilarious solos, poetry, folk and jazz, all MC'd by a roving druid.

We hope to plant a dyers garden and to cultivate some of our own dye plants and herbs here at the school, and to hold some children's events and craft classes during the summer. There will also be volunteering opportunities for anyone wishing to participate in research, to help with preparing museum exhibitions or helping with children's events.



We are getting to know each other and trust each other as we explore together what God might be wishing us to do as a Ministry Area. We worship and pray together as we try to develop a vision for our new grouping of 14

churches, and as we seek to develop the ways in which we can work together which will support and encourage each of the churches within the Ministry Area. An important part of what we do together is exploring the ways in which we can encourage the work of mission across our 14 communities. The Team are beginning to gel together and at our next meeting we shall be discussing the launch of a Ministry Area "Explorers" or "Discipleship" group and what sort of materials we might use.

Although our Ministry Area was inaugurated in January it will not be fully commissioned until we have appointed a Ministry Area Council - to use the official term. I think we will call it a Ministry Area Forum which better describes its function. Some churches have already made appointments; others still need to do so in order to ensure even representation across all 14 churches.

All Hallows Eve - or Holy Evening

Modern Halloween celebrations have their roots with the Celtic peoples of pre-Christian times.

In those long-ago days, on the last night of October, the Celts celebrated the Festival of Samhain, or 'Summer's End'. The priests, or Druids, performed ceremonies to thank and honour the sun. For there was a very dark side to all this: Samhain also signalled the onset of winter, a time when it was feared that unfriendly ghosts, nature-spirits, and witches roamed the earth, creating mischief. So the Druid priests lit great bonfires and performed magic rites to ward off or appease these dark supernatural powers.

Then the Romans arrived, and brought their Harvest Festival, which honoured the Goddess Pomona with gifts

of apples and nuts. The two festivals slowly merged.

When Christianity arrived still later, it began to replace the Roman and Druid religions. First of November, All Saints' Day, was dedicated to all Christian Martyrs and Saints who had died. It was called 'All Hallows' Day'. The evening before became an evening of prayer and preparation and was called 'All Hallows' Eve', The Holy Evening, later shortened to 'Halloween'.

For many centuries, however, fear of the supernatural remained strong. During the Middle Ages, animal costumes and frightening masks were worn to ward off the evil spirits of

darkness on Halloween. Magic words and charms were used to keep away bad luck, and everybody believed that witches rode about on broomsticks. Fortune telling was popular, and predicting the future by the use of nuts and apples was so popular that Halloween is still sometimes known as Nutcrack Night or Snap-Apple Night.

Today, Christians have learned to turn to prayer instead of charms to overcome the powers of darkness. And the deeper, true meaning of All Hallows' Eve, should not be forgotten. As Christians, we all draw closer to Christ when we remember and give thanks for our loved ones and for others who have gone before us through the gates of death.

FARM FOCUS - Some Thought It Couldn't Be Done



Rhos Market Garden, three acres of vegetables, stands at nearly 1,000 feet. Mick and Aice Westrip arrived at Rhos-y-meirch in a cold winter ten years ago to rent a caravan and a small plot of land. Over the next five years they converted what was nutrition poor, acidic, wet land to a productive, organic vegetable garden.

The first year was diabolical with wire worms hanging from any scrawny carrot that had the audacity to grow. They have gradually transformed the soil by using composted farmyard manure and 'green manure' (clovers grown to turn in for compost and fertility). Poly tunnels provide propagation and winter growing. The cucumbers and tomatoes will soon make way for winter salads.

After five years they bought a flat patch on the other side of the road and built their eco house, a pleasant home with big windows facing south for warmth, good insulation and solar energy for hot water.

They rotate their three acres annually. A large strip of legumes (peas, beans, salad) gives way to alliums (leeks and

onions) and so on for the brassicas (cabbage, kale, purple sprouting) the cucurbita (squash and courgettes), root crops and flowers. At any time 2/9ths of the fields will be out of active production, resting and restoring fertility.

Mick and Alice soon sold organic veg at both Presteigne and Knighton markets stalls. They have been helped throughout by neighbours and keen volunteers who believe in the health and taste benefits of organic, as well as the positive interaction with nature. They have had a few small grants, including for a wildlife pond. They are inspected annually; the only complaint is the paper work! In 2015 they opened a shop in Knighton, which showcases their own veg, organic produce from further afield and groceries, as well as a range of other 'sustainable' products.




