



#### New Radnor Isn't Very New

The first New Radnor Church was founded by the Normans soon after 1095. In 1188 Baldwin, Archbishop of Canterbury, accompanied by Giraldus Cambrensis, the Archdeacon of Brecon, preached his first sermon here on his journey through Wales to form the third crusade.

Tradition says that the second 15<sup>th</sup> Century building was ruined, along with the castle, by Owain Glyndwr.

After the New Radnor market was discontinued, and the town declined in the 17th Century, William Wordsworth's brother-in-law, a local tenant farmer, wrote that the walls of the rubbish-strewn churchyard were broken down and it was the resort of sheep, goats, cattle and swine. There was no sexton and the churchwardens were slothful.

In 1828 John Merrywether, Dean of Hereford, became Rector. He was an absentee Rector, very unpopular and described the parishoners as "insolent smockfrocks and hobnails". New Radnor was then in Hereford diocese, and colourful shields along the gallery and encaustic floor tiles behind the altar represent the Hereford Deaneries.

During Merrywether's time the church was dismantled and re-built, a project beset by problems. Funds were


insufficient; workmen's wages were not paid. A mass of human bones was found in one place and a corresponding number of skulls in another, thought to be the result of Owain Glyndwr's visit. The tower was too small for the bell. The beautiful screen was used to make panels for the apse and the altar rail. The carved and gilded boss in the roof above the altar is also from the old building. The Church was eventually opened with great celebrations in 1845.

The renowned architect George Pace reordered the interior in 1964. He moved the organ to the gallery, the font to the south transept, and the altar forward to face the congregation. The new clergy stall, altar cross, candlesticks and offertory plate are also part of his design.

Two of the jewels at New Radnor are these 13th Century tomb covers (see below). The effigies, probably coffin lids, were found on the south side of the churchyard sometime before 1905. They are now eroded but beautifully

displayed in the south transept.

#### The Cover — St Catherine

The medieval window in a chapel at St Laurence's, Ludlow, shows a familiar November saint, Catherine. She holds the two instruments of her martyrdom: the wheel and the sword. She was martyred in the early 4th century by the emperor of Alexandria, Maxentius.

Catherine became a Christian around the age of fourteen, converted hundreds of people to Christianity, and was martyred around the age of 18.

She had rebuked Maxentius for persecuting Christians, and so he summoned fifty of the best pagan philosophers to dispute with her. Catherine won the debate. Several of her adversaries, conquered by her eloquence, declared themselves Christians and were at once put to death.

Catherine was then scourged and imprisoned, during which time over 200 people came to see her, including Maxentius' wife. They all converted to Christianity and were subsequently martyred.

Maxentius then tried to win the beautiful and wise princess over by proposing marriage. Catherine refused. The furious emperor condemned Catherine to death on a spiked wheel, but, at her touch, it shattered. Maxentius finally had her beheaded with a sword.

#### Not 50 years...?

Peter Cope said: "This was the reaction I had several times when I mentioned that I was going to celebrate 50 years as an Anglican priest on September 24th – but I was ordained Deacon at 24 in 1966.

"We had a lovely celebration Eucharist at St Edward's, and I am grateful that around 50 came from the Benefice and wider Ministry Area. I was giving thanks for the blessings of being brought up in a Christian family; of having a wise parish priest in Canon Harold Heal; in going to a school with a strong Christian ethos; in being able to read Theology at Oxford, but also then to broaden my horizons by doing a Management Diploma, an MSc in Industrial Relations, and eventually a PhD in Christian Social Ethics. I have also had the great privilege of being able to work as a partner in Christian ministry with my dear wife Melia!

"Some of you at least will be aware that I spent most of my 41 years of ministry as industrial chaplain in different

parts of Britain. I was glad, therefore, to be able to preach about the responsibility we all share as Jesus' disciples for mission and ministry, and to have one reading from the book of Jonah. Jonah's story about taking God's message of love and justice to the great pagan city of Nineveh reminded me of some of the companies in which I have been the chaplain – Kodak, or Metal Box, or GKN, or even West Mercia Police.

"So my prayer for the Christians of this Ministry Area is that we should remember that Jesus calls us to be disciples so that we can reach out with his love and care to all those we meet; and that we should be so filled by His Spirit with love, goodness and truth that we can't help sharing it, so that His Kingdom may be built in our communities here."





# The Cure for Headaches: Saint of the Month 10th November - Aed mac Bricc - 6th Century Bishop of Killare

Which saint to choose for November? Illtud, Cybi, Hilda, Columbanus? Well, this is my birthday month, so I have chosen my birthday saint, the rather obscure Aed mac Bricc. No, I hadn't heard of him either until I went to Ireland. On one of the highest mountains in Donegal, Slieve League falls on one side 600 metres into the Atlantic Ocean, I found some ruins which turned out to be the hermitage of Aed mac Bricc, and his holy well (shown here).

He was contemporary with, and a distant cousin of, St Columba, both descended from the powerful Ui Neill. His

principal church was at Rahugh in Westmeath, not far from Columba's monastery at Durrow. Aed performed a great number of unusual miracles. He could be the patron saint of damsels in distress, the freer of captives or the greatest peacemaker of his time in Ireland, not to mention his flying chariot, but he is actually the patron saint of headaches. He even cured St Brigit's headache, several miles away in Kildare. There is still a headache stone in the churchyard at Rahugh. This is a stone with a head-sized imprint and the rain water collected in it will cure your headache. There are many such stones in Ireland. An 8th century Latin protection poem, written by an Irish scribe has recently been found

in Germany, in a manuscript from Reichenau Monastery on Lake Constance.

Here are a couple of verses:

Aed, O goodwilled saint Mac Bricc, From the pure I ask the prayers That he cools the noxious fluxes

That flow heated in my head,

That he cures my head with my kidneys, And with the other parts afflicted, With my eyes and with my cheekbones, With my ears and with my nostrils.



#### Who were those people 6,000 years ago?


The Walton Basin (also called the *Radnor Valley*) is an archaeologist's dream! Our churches of Evenjobb, New Radnor and Llanfihangel Nantmelan ring the basin. Over the years people have found hundreds of knapped flints and other worked stones in the valley. Identifiable objects include arrowheads and polished stone axes, dating from 10,000 to 1500 BC.

Archaeologists have surveyed Neolithic enclosures, ring-ditches, burial mounds, a stone circle and standing stones. When you cross the valley, you won't be aware of any of this; it looks like fairly flat agricultural land, featureless apart from the surrounding ring of hills. But aerial photography and geophysical surveys have revealed this extraordinary concentration of ancient sites, showing that the Radnor Valley was an important site 6,000 years ago. The one thing you might discover is four standing stones, shown in the photo. They stand between 0.9 metres and 1.8 metres high and date from the Neolithic 4000-2300BC or Bronze Age (2300-1500 BC). We don't know their use, possibly for rituals or astronomy or as burial markers.

Information from "Walton Basin: archaeology and conservation" by Bill Britnell

The map shows the impressive Hindwell Cursus stretching for five kilometres from Evenjobb roughly to Walton, one of the longest known in Great Britain. Excavations reveal two parallel ditches 64 metres apart, which measure 3.8 to 3.9 metres across and 1.45 to 1.8m deep. The Hindwell cursus required excavating 90,000 tons of gravel. The map also shows a palisaded enclosure: a roughly circular trench fitted with vertical timber palisades. The Hindwell palisaded enclosure would have required 6,700 tons of gravel and 3,300 tons of timber!



#### Recipe - Classic Squash Soup

This is the season for all sorts of squash; like those shown in the photo.

#### Ingredients:

- 25g butter
- 1 small onion, chopped
- 1 stalk celery, chopped
- 1 medium butternut squash \*peeled, seeded and cubed
- 1 medium carrot, chopped
- 2 medium potatoes, cubed
- 500ml chicken or vegetable stock
- salt and pepper to taste

#### Method

- 1. Melt the butter in a large pot, and cook the onion, celery, carrot, potatoes and squash on a lowish temperature for 5 minutes. Pour in enough of the chicken stock to cover vegetables. Bring to the boil. Reduce heat to low, cover pot and simmer 40 minutes, or until all vegetables are tender.
- 2. Transfer the soup to a blender, and blend until smooth (alternatively, use a hand-held stick blender). Return to pot, and mix in any remaining stock to attain desired consistency (alternatively you may add either milk or cream for a 'Cream of Squash' soup.) Season with salt and pepper.

\*If you find it difficult to peel squash, cut it in half, remove the seeds, and bake it cut side down for an hour for a large squash, less for a small one. Cool and scoop out the flesh.




# St HUGH of LINCOLN 17<sup>th</sup> November

#### Flora and Fauna

November, with its shorter days, some often quite dreary, can deliver a few lovely surprises in the garden. Our gardens are like a sanctuary from the outside world, a place to enjoy peace, recharge the batteries, observe nature.

Hanging baskets always please. With some of the summer favourites now in the compost bin, why not add delightful little violas, bellis, heathers, pansies, grasses, small conifers. These will raise the spirits in weeks to come. Trailing plants like ivies and creeping thymes will add a lovely soft finish to the basket. If you have a small pumpkin, place it in the centre to add a little atmosphere in your autumn garden.
