St Edward's Knighton

Many visitors' comments mention the beauty of St Edward's and the sense of peace they feel as they enter. The present building is not old as churches go: it was only opened in 1877, with the chancel at the east end added in 1897. The church was originally dedicated to St Lawrence, but was changed to St Edward (the Confessor) at some stage, for unknown reasons. It is believed to be the only St Edward's in Wales.

Today's church is a lovely example of a late Victorian church, with wall decorations in the chancel and a superb east window of the ascended Christ added to commemorate the Diamond Jubilee of Queen Victoria in 1897. However, it is probably the fourth on this site, since there is a reference to a Saxon church here around the year 990 AD, and to a Norman church around 1160.

The tower is of Medieval origin and the masonry in the lower stages, together with its east arch, is 14th century.


One item of interest is to be found near the font; the ship's anchor was the gift of a past organist, Lt Commander Henry Bray, who served this church for many years. The anchor is an early Christian symbol which was used as a disguised cross during the period of Roman persecution to guide the way to secret meeting places. It is a symbol of hope: our faith, like an anchor, holds one steadfast in the times of trial and doubt. That symbol is still so relevant today and the baptism font is an appropriate place to display it.

It is hoped that we will soon have permission to remove a few rows of pews from the back of the church so that we have space to offer hospitality after some services and so that baptism families can gather around the font (currently hemmed in by pews). One row of pews removed at the front will facilitate our welcome to choirs – and to children who come from Knighton Church in Wales School to perform in church from time-to-time.

A member of the congregation, expressing her sense of St Edward's says, "Worshippers experience joy, love, and fellowship as they worship together. God's Love is here for everyone."

Dear Fríends,

'Peace on earth, goodwill to all', we will be singing very soon, echoing the angels who announced Jesus' birth. May those words be the sincere prayer of our hearts. Peace, in its fullest sense, including wholeness and health, is much needed. At this time of year when appeals from many charities drop through our doors almost every day, we can feel overwhelmed by the needs of the world. We know it's not only the

world 'out there', far away, that is in need: in our own country, homelessness and despair is the experience of too many. In our urban areas, people sleep rough and many families live in insecure, temporary accommodation. The need for Food Banks continues. Months after the Grenfell Tower tragedy, local churches continue to support survivors and the local community.

What a world of contrasts: the TV blares out advert after advert about things guaranteed to give us a perfect Christmas: one tells us of a computer game - 'only £399'. Say it quickly and it doesn't sound so much; one Christmas present.

'Are you ready for Christmas? The pressure to have enough festive food in sufficient variety; enough presents, enough wrapping paper, sticky tape, cards...endless 'must haves'. In a world of great need, let's keep a sense of perspective this year. As we reflect on the untimely birth of young Mary's first child – laid in a borrowed crib a long way from home – we are reminded that, as Jesuit scholar Brendan Byrne comments, 'God does not wait until all is right, ready and perfect before entering the human scene. God enters it as it is.'

May God catch us unawares this Christmas and give us fresh perspective on what really matters.

The Cover – First Christmas

This lovely image of the birth of Christ is from St Phillips in Birmingham. It is part of one of the east windows which includes shepherds, angels and sheep. Burne-Jones has placed the birth in a cave, rather than the traditional stable. Mary is dressed in vibrant, traditional blue. She gazes reverently on the infant Christ. Jesus who appears sweet and small and vulnerable.

St Phillips contains some of the finest of the Pre-Raphaelite Burne-Jones's work. He was a true son of the parish, baptised at St Phillips in 1834. The glass was made in the workshop of William Morris and installed in the 1880's.

Happily during World War II the windows were removed and placed in a disused mine in Wales for safe-keeping. The cathedral was seriously bombed and lost its roof; the Burne-Jones masterpieces would have been destroyed without that forethought.



A good congregation from across our fourteen churches came to St Michael's Beguildy, the most northerly in our Ministry Area, for Bible Sunday.

"Listen" was the point. When the Israelites listened Ezra reading the Word they wept, but he encouraged them: "Don't weep. Rejoice." Melia encouraged us to read and re-read Bible passages, to hold on to a phrase which resonates with us. That is 'listening'.

Mark found that reading God's Word led him to prayer, it was the time when he felt closest to God, a time to listen.

Jean Shuker from Knighton spoke of the tremendous value daily Bible reading had had in her life. Our prayers, readings and music brought us deeper into God's Word.

After being encouraged to read more and to read deeply, we chatted to friends over delicious tea and cake provided by the congregation. Some new to the church explored and found treasures: a Green Man, a 13th Century warden's chest, fine 20th Century stained glass.

Kentigern / Mungo - The Saint with Two Names - 13th January


St Serf, abbot of Culross in Scotland, was in his monastery one day when a bedraggled princess with her baby son staggered in and asked for help. Teneu was the disgraced daughter of the king of Lothian and her little son was Kentigern. They had been sent out into the Firth of Forth in a little boat and they had survived.

Serf loved little Kentigern and gave him a pet name, Mungo, "my dear one", and Mungo became a star pupil. When he was grown up he set off west to evangelise the Britons of Strathclyde and built a church in a lovely glen called Glas Cau, "green hollow". Later a cathedral was built on this spot and is still there, in the middle of Glasgow, dedicated to St Mungo.

The new king of Strathclyde objected to Christians and Kentigern went south to visit his kinsmen in north Wales. On the way he spent some time in Cumbria and there are still place names and church dedications there to both Kentigern and Mungo. In north Wales, Kentigern founded a monastery beside the River Elwy in Gwynedd. His most promising student was called Asaph.

Always beside you. - Walter Winchell But soon Kentigern was off again, as the next king of Strathclyde, Riderch Hael was favourable to Christians and Kentigern was sent for, back to the land where he was known as Mungo. The monastery at Llanelwy was left in the good hands of Asaph and when the cathedral was built it was dedicated to St Asaph, that most able of students.






New Path Is a Delight at Gladestry Church







Advent Wreath:

The Advent Ring in church consists of bright green evergreens, maybe cones or berries, as a base for the four candles arranged around the ring, one to be lit each Sunday. On Christmas morning the central white candle will be added and lit. Evergreen Drama:

As the autumn fades and the garden slows down, we begin to appreciate the wonderful evergreens: holly, ivy, spruce, juniper and laurel. The leaf shapes show up so well against the deciduous shrubs. 

Castle Ring Hillfort



Size: Castle Ring is one kilometre north of Evenjobb, at the top of the hill, 340 metres (1,115 feet) high. It is 70 by 140 metres (230 x 460 feet) and encloses just under a hectare. The enclosure today is pasture with mature beeches lining the surrounding ramparts and ditch.

What did they do here? We don't know much about what the people who lived here did, but from excavations in the Walton Basin we assume that they raised cereals and perhaps animals. Castle Ring might have been the domain of one family, or a site, possibly only seasonal, for a group.

Who lived here? The Walton basin is on the periphery of three Iron Age tribes: Ordovices of mid Wales, Dobunni of southwest Midlands and Silures of south Wales. Which tribes lived here is uncertain.

More than one hillfort. Castle Ring is one of two hillforts on the eastern side of the Walton Basin dating from the same period. Burfa Bank Hillfort is larger with two ramparts and further banks and ditches, enclosing 7 hectares.

Getting to Castle Ring Hillfort: (take a picnic and imagine our Iron Age ancestors)

On the road between Whitton and Evenjobb turn off at the top of the hill towards Thorn. After .4 mile turn right at the entrance for Castle Ring Oak Frame. Park immediately at the parking area on the right. Walk a short way up the drivable track until a lesser track breaks off right. Follow that for a minute to enter at a gate on the left. You are at the outer ditch for Castle Ring Hillfort. Explore to your heart's content!

Recipe - Root Veg Tarte Tatin

Serves 2 as a main course. Tarte Tatin is baked upside-down. Vegetables are arranged on the bottom of the tin; when turned out they form an attractive pattern. Use baby veg or cut full-sized roots. Roasted garlic makes it creamy.

Ingredients:

250g/8oz puff pastry (your own or use shop-bought) 300-400g/10-14oz root vegetables $15g/\frac{1}{2}$ oz unsalted butter 1 tbsp fresh herbs, finely chopped (thyme and rosemary work well) salt and pepper, to taste vinaigrette (optional), for drizzling

Method:

• Roll out the pastry and cut out a disc of 22cm/8.5 inches diameter (that is, just bigger than the base of the tin).

Wrap in baking paper and put in the refrigerator. • Preheat the oven to 180°C/350°F/gas mark 4. Arrange the prepared vegetables in the base of the tin, remembering that the underside will be what is on display once served. Dot over the butter, sprinkle with three-quarters of the herbs and season well with salt and pepper. Cover the top of the tin with foil and bake for 20-40

minutes until the vegetables are tender. • Remove from the oven and take off the foil. Turn the oven up to 190°C/375°F/gas mark 5. Place the pastry disc over the top of the vegetables. Tuck the edges down the sides. Return the tin to the oven and bake for a further 20 minutes until the pastry is puffed up and golden. Remove from the oven and leave to cool in the tin for 10 minutes.

To Serve: Turn out, inverted, on to a serving board. Peel off the base paper, scatter with the remaining chopped herbs and drizzle with a vinaigrette if liked.





Farm Focus: Evergreen Trees

Christmastime means Christmas trees. This year's Westminster Parliamentary Review featured **Evergreen Christmas Trees**, a local family business. It was founded 22 years ago in Beguildy by Stephen Reynolds. The Field Manager, Philip Fourie, is a Beguildy churchwarden.

The company has 170 acres scattered over several sites. They grow quality Norway Spruce, Fraser Fir and Nordmann Fir. A Christmas tree is more labour intensive than it appears; there is no immediate return. Here is the process.

- 1. Prepare the soil for proper acidity.
- 2. Plough the fields ready for planting.



3. Plant seedlings purchased from Denmark; 15-20cm is optimum for Teme Valley conditions.

- 4. Fertilise for four years.
- 5. At five years, start to prune.

6. Attach colour coded labels for size and quality, making harvesting simpler. Maturity after five years: a six foot tree will probably take 7-8 years. The smallest tree they sell is 3 feet; the tallest is 18 feet.

7. Harvesting: A machine cuts the tree with the right label and a tractor nets them. When the tractor takes them to the yard, they are mixed to fill customer orders, usually various sizes of all three varieties They are placed on

pallets and loaded onto artics for delivery to garden centres and farm shops.

Marketing is where Evergreen has expanded. Their son, Charlie Reynolds, now runs Keele Christmas Trees. There is also a smaller site in Condover near Shrewsbury and a new location near Cowbridge – Ty Cerrig. In addition they supply sixteen different franchises (pop-up shops). Basically they are selling all over the country: Carlisle to Cornwall, Cambridge to Cowbridge.

Knighton and District Rotary Club

Later in the month we spoke to the pupils of Knighton Primary School about the efforts of Rotary members across the globe to eradicate polio. We also had two stalls in Knighton on October 28th to promote the "Purple 4 Polio" project to end polio worldwide – only two countries to go. And finally we heard Caroline Yorke from the Search and Rescue Dogs (SARDA) Wales about her fascinating experiences being involved with this excellent charity.


