

Offa's Dyke and the Offa's Dyke Path in Radnorshire

Pew people in Radnorshire can be unaware of the existence of Offa's Dyke, but how many actually know exactly what, or where, it is?

If you were to ask this question of the proverbial man in the street he might well direct you to the nearest signpost on the Offa's Dyke Path. But that is not necessarily the same thing. The Offa's Dyke Path is a long distance walking route which, having been opened (in Knighton) in 1971, is approaching its half-century. Offa's Dyke itself though is much, much older. Thirteen centuries old, most historians and archaeologists believe.

Offa's Dyke is so called because it is generally believed to have been built on the orders of Offa, the King of Mercia, a Saxon kingdom which occupied the midlands of the country we now call England. No-one knows

for sure though, because there are no written records from the time. The Dyke consists of an earth bank and ditch and, according to this theory, marked the western boundary of Mercia, beyond which were the lands of the Welsh Princes, lands which later became the country we call Wales. To this day Offa's Dyke is often referred to as shorthand for the border between Wales and England.


There are several places to see Offa's Dyke in Radnorshire, two of the best are on Hengwm Hill, just south of the B4355 Knighton-Presteigne road, and Discoed, where a very fine section climbs the south side of the Lugg Valley. In both cases access is via the Offa's Dyke Path, which runs on or alongside the Dyke in both locations. There is also an easily accessible short section of the Dyke in

the park behind the Offa's Dyke Centre in Knighton.

The Offa's Dyke Centre is of course the place to go to learn more about Offa, his Dyke and the Path which bears its name. In fact the Offa's Dyke Path goes right by the door, on its way from Chepstow, in Monmouthshire, to Prestatyn, on the North Wales coast, a total distance of 177 miles.

Shrove Tuesday, Mardi Gras or Pancake day falls on March 5th and heralds the arrival of Lent, traditionally a time for more frugal meals. However the passage of time has seen a dramatic change in the way in which we mark the season of Lent. Few of us abandon animal fat and restrict ourselves to a little fish or white meat to supplement an otherwise vegetarian diet. The traditions have changed but what lies at the heart of Lent is unchanged. Lent is a time of spiritual preparation for Holy Week and Easter, when we recognise that there is more to life than our physical bodies.

Did your parents tell you that you would appreciate a desired object more if you had to save up for it? The waiting I was told would enhance the enjoyment of the eventual purchase. Like the smell of a good meal, anticipation only adds to the experience. Instant gratification is not healthy. So, I believe, it should be with Easter. This is the greatest celebration in the Christian calendar and without suitable preparation its value is diminished. What we do in Lent is a bit like saving up for that longed for item. During Lent we begin to appreciate the value of Easter, as we reflect upon our behaviour and the upcoming anniversary of Jesus' sacrifice we realise the price that was paid. But this is not a price we ourselves pay, however as we follow Jesus ever nearer to Jerusalem we witness his willingness to pay the price on our behalf and we are humbled.

Fancy an Anglo-Saxon Pancake?

Ever wonder why we eat pancakes just before Lent? The tradition dates back to Anglo-Saxon times, when Christians spent Lent in repentance and severe fasting.

So on the Tuesday before Ash Wednesday, the church bell would summon them to confession, where they would be 'shriven', or absolved from their sins. This custom gives us *Shrove* Tuesday. At home, they would then eat up their last eggs and fat, and making a pancake was the easiest way to do this. For the next 47 days, they pretty well starved themselves.

Why Pancake Races?

Pancakes feature in cookery books as far back as 1439, and today's pancake races are in remembrance of a panicked woman back in 1445 in Olney, Buckinghamshire. She was making pancakes when she heard the shriving bell calling her to confession. Afraid she'd be late, she ran to the church in a panic, still in her apron, and still holding the pan.

Why the Ashes?

Lent begins with Ash Wednesday on March 6th. But why the 'Ash'? The tradition goes right back to the Old Testament.

When the Israelites sinned they mourned for the damage and evil they had done. As part of their

repentance, they covered their heads with ashes. That and rending their clothes was an outward sign of their heart-felt repentance.

In the very early Christian Church, the new converts had ashes sprinkled over them at the beginning of Lent. Soon many other Christians wanted to take part in the custom, at the start of Lent.



The actual custom of 'ashing' was abolished at the Reformation, though the old name for the day remained. Today receiving the mark of ashes is optional. It reminds people of their mortality: "Remember that you are dust and to dust you will return..." (Genesis 3:19)

Since medieval times we burn the branches used on Palm Sunday in the previous year in order to create the ashes for today. *Parish Pump*

Scrumptious Food at the Pop up Restaurant (see page 16)

The Peal of Bells

Knighton boasts eight bells, six cast in 1721-22 by the bell founder Abraham Rudall in Gloucester.

The bells weigh between 3½ to 10 hundredweight, that is half a ton. Imagine loading a half ton bell onto a wagon towed by horses all the way from Gloucester to Knighton. How did they get all six to the top of the tower? Trying to manoeuvre your new sofa through the front door looks simple by comparison!

When a bell needed tuning they simply bashed off a bit of metal with a hammer.

The bells contain individual inscriptions like *Peace and Good*

Neighbourhood or Abr Rvdhall Cast Vs All 1722. One bell names the churchwardens.

Two more bells were added by Barwells in Birmingham in 1914 when all the bells were re-hung onto a steel angle frame.

Today Roger Thomas is the only regular ringer, a 'campanologist', but he is assisted by several Presteigne ringers and guests from other communities.

The big bells are quite a pull. Around the ringing chamber there are polished wooden boards with names of ringers to commemorate special peals. Between ringing sessions the bells hang down as shown in the photos, but during ringing they are turned upwards.

Knighton actually has nine bells if you count the little *sanctus* bell (formerly rung at the high point of Holy Communion). In the past the bells would have been rung before most services. Today you might only catch their wonderful peals at weddings, bell practice, and special church occasions.

The clock in the tower was made in 1857 by John Moore & Sons in London; it strikes the hours on the Tenor bell.

Remembrance Ring

On Saturday 2 February a group of ringers gathered in St Edward's, Knighton to honour two of WW1 dead by ringing a quarter peal. The first method tried was Candlesby Slow Course Triples, a method new to most ringers. Unfortunately the method was halted about half way through when it became obvious that it was rather too advanced for some of the assembled company. After a brief rest the group tried again with a quarter peal of 1260 Grandsire Triples which went well.

The quarter peal was rung in remembrance of Private Frank Griffiths Dyke who died on the 20th October 1918 at the age of 19 and Hector Lance Corporal Philip Seabourne who died exactly 100 years ago on that date aged 22 following a bout of pneumonia. Both were ringers at St Edward's. It is unfortunate that Hector Seabourne, who is buried in the cemetery just along from St Edward's, survived WW1 only to be taken by pneumonia just 3 months after his demob.



his month's featured painting in the National Gallery has a very unusual theme. It shows Christ blessing John the Baptist by Moretto da Brescia, an Italian artist who died in 1554. It is not a scene we find in the Gospels, but it is likely that the artist was thinking

of that moment in Matthew's Gospel when John admits that he needs to be baptised by Jesus.

"Let it be so now," Jesus replies, and He is baptized by John. It is the prelude to our Lord's wilderness experience – that time of testing when



Mothering Sunday Goes Back a Bit!

other Church, Mother Earth, Mother of the Gods, our human mothers have all been part of the celebration of 'Mothering Sunday' as the fourth Sunday in Lent is affectionately known. It has been celebrated in the UK since at least the 16th century.

In Roman times, great festivals were held every spring to honour Cybele, Mother of all the Gods. Other pagan festivals in honour of Mother Earth were also celebrated. With the arrival

of Christianity, the festival became one honouring Mother Church.

During the Middle Ages, young people apprenticed to craftsmen or working as 'live-in' servants were allowed only one holiday a year on which to visit their families - which is how 'Mothering Sunday' got its name. This special day became a day of family rejoicing, and the Lenten fast was broken. In some places the day was called 'Simnel Day', because of the sweet cakes called


'simnel cakes' traditionally eaten on that day.

In recent years the holiday changed and in many ways now



Cuthbert - The Best Loved Saint of the North - 20th March

Ct Cuthbert is the St Francis of the North. He loved animals.

Born into a fairly well-off Anglo-Saxon family, he became first a monk (651) and later the Prior at Melrose Abbey.

He was sent as Prior to Lindisfarne Island where he was much loved His zeal was evident in his constant preaching, teaching, and visiting of the people. He was also said to have gifts of prophecy and healing.

Occasionally, Cuthbert reached 'people overload'. Then he retreated to a tiny islet called Inner Farne, where he could pray in total seclusion. There he befriended and protected the Eider ducks, named 'cuddy ducks' after him. It is said that he prayed in the sea nearby up to his neck in water; the otters came to dry his feet. The window at Durham shows him at one with all of the birds.

When, to his horror, he was told he had been made Bishop of Hexham, he immediately 'swapped' sees with an old friend Eata, and stayed on at Lindisfarne as Bishop. Sadly, he died on little Inner Farne, only two years later, on 20 March, 687.

He was buried at Lindisfarne, but that is not the end of his story. After the Vikings destroyed Lindisfarne in 875, several monks dug him up and set out to find Cuthbert a final, and safe, resting place. For the next 120 years Cuthbert was deposited in various monasteries around the north of England and southwest Scotland. Finally, in 999, Cuthbert was allowed to rest in Durham, where a Saxon church was built over his shrine.
