Beguildy is Steeped in Medieval History

The first reference (Historic Churches) to be found of Beguildy appears as 'Bugelte' in 1259 AD and in 1291 AD 'Bugeyylde' hence 'Shepherd's House'.

The date of the earliest church in the village is unknown but in the reference above, it was valued at "O£ 10-13 shillings and 4d". Saint Michael's contains several ancient artefacts including a rare screen and Green Man carving.

There are several old houses still standing and occupied in our community dated from medieval times. The most notable is Bryndraenog, described as one of the best preserved medieval houses in Wales. It was built around 1436 as a single storey building with base crucks and an open fire on the floor in the centre of the hall. Later, it was modified around 1636 with a second minstrel storey and a gallery. Bryndraenog used was as courthouse and the gaol was at Pantycaragle, which unfortunately burnt down in 1930. One wall of the gaol is still there. Rumour has it that there is a tunnel between the two houses with the standing stone marking half way.

On the Beacon Hill, above Middle Cwm-Y-Ringel, is a very deep, dry crater. This hole, known locally as Prodger's Hole, is believed to have been made by a meteorite impact. At Upper Cwm-Y-Ringel, a draining contractor allegedly found a meteorite stone.

Also on the beacon, on top of Warren Bank, are two mounds that are believed to be tumuli; however this has never been proven. There was also a lead mine which was worked up until the early 1900's.

Quarrying also took place at both Cwm-Y-Ringel and Wern-Y-Gyniog where flag stones were dug out and processed. A small community once lived there with a school, and the ruins can still be seen today.

A primitive Methodist chapel was built between the Brook House and the bridge and opened in August 1851. It was later washed away by the River Teme.

The first pub in Beguildy was The Oxford Arms (Church Cottage now.)

In 1822 Alexander Marple was the Innkeeper. It closed about 1850 and the new pub, which opened in 1851, was The Mason's Arms. This was an old house with a very low thatched roof. It had a stable one end and the other end was used as a pound for stray animals. It was also used as a grocery shop and sold beer. This was run by Mr Robert Eaton who used to walk to Shrewsbury fortnightly to bring back the tea, sugar and tobacco needed in the district. This journey took him around 18 hours.

By 1861 this building was called The Radnorshire Arms. Around 1936, a frame was built around the old building, the thatch was removed and a new slate roof was put on and the stable was converted into 'a tidy bar room'.

The building by the brook was originally a post office and then became a stable and storage for the pub. It later became a butchers shop after the present Post Office was built in 1895.

Abraham Thomas, Vicar of Beguildy in 1842-1893, probably did more for the community than any other vicar before or since by organising and raising money to build Crug-y-byddar church. two schools Headmasters' houses. He kept a detailed diary of the building of the church and also kept records about extensively around preaching Radnorshire. When these were completed, he then planned and built the new vicarage. He had spent everything he had, including his wife's dowry of £5000 and was made bankrupt just before he died. Sadly we have lost our vicarage, our Vicar lives in Knighton and our schools are no more but we are fortunate to still have our village shop with a post office, pub and church.

We have left the forty days of Lent and have entered the forty days of Eastertide, those days that Jesus spent with his disciples after his Resurrection and before his Ascension. A period of reassurance, restoration and forgiveness, a time for human friendship as well as teaching before Jesus returns to his heavenly Father.

On the night after he rose Jesus brings his followers peace and hope while they are meeting together in fear and disappointment, by breathing on them his Holy Spirit. Then on the shores of Lake Galilee after a miraculous haul of fish, Peter is forgiven and restored after his agonising denial of Jesus. When Jesus is with his disciples remarkable things happen, but Jesus is returning to his Father in heaven and once again his disciples will be left bereft, drifting like a rudderless ship or so it seems.

On the night after he rose Jesus breathed his Spirit on them, but on the lake shore Jesus tells them to wait in Jerusalem until his Father sends them the gift he has promised – that same Holy Spirit! There seems to be something of an incubation taking place here. The disciples have received the Holy Spirit and it has calmed their fears, but not until Pentecost (ten days after Ascension and fifty days after Passover) does the Spirit manifest itself in full power and glory!

After his Ascension Jesus was not present physically but the astonishing events of Pentecost confirmed for the disciples that his Holy Spirit was most certainly present and that the Spirit carried all the authority and power of their Lord and friend. That Holy Spirit lives within us, that same authority and power that was within Jesus is within us and we will celebrate it at Pentecost on June 9th.

Flora and Fauna

The month of May is recognised by the Church as the month of Mary, the Mother of Jesus, and traditionally associated with children and flowers.

This month all gardeners go into overdrive with the challenge of planning and growing vegetables and flowers for the months ahead. Greenhouses, windowsills and all available space is taken up with young seedlings eager to get out into the warmed up soil. The old local saying, "Wait for the May Fair to leave town" still seems true here as late May frosts still happen, ruining young plants. The scent of the hyacinths dominates the garden, soon to be replaced with magnificent scent from the lilac and magnolia trees. Clematis (Montana) will soon be spreading its froth of pink and white flowers over walls, trellises and pergolas. Equally pretty, blue and white grape hyacinths are another delight. The sound of the honeybees visiting them is a welcome bonus. In a shady corner you will soon notice the nodding white bells of the dainty lily-of-the-valley with its perfume. All parts of this plant are toxic; do be careful.

Tulips, planted in late autumn, are now at their peak, many deliciously streaked and flecked in contrasting colours, ranging from white, yellow, rose through to red, purple and black. The tulip is now a favourite with most flower arrangers, with their interesting shape, long stems and exciting colours to choose from.

There are also constantly arts and craft exhibitions in the area as well as an increasing number of literary events. The local churches and chapels have weekday Lent groups on offer.

The weather around here has varied from a challenging early February to

record-breaking warm and sunny weather later in the month and really stormy weather as I write. But lambing has to proceed regardless.

March 20th is already the Spring Equinox with the bonus of longer days and the growing-season taking off. The Gardeners' Club has an enterprising programme including several visits to outstanding gardens. Meanwhile there is increasing activity in and around the allotments.

The early spring weather in the area has been erratic with a covering of snow well into April and some quite extreme rainfall. to make a better world.


Moving on. thev experienced a beautiful white representation of the Last Supper.





Cathedrals to Mark Moon Landing Anniversary

Space suits, meteorite fragments and a giant sculpture of the moon are to be displayed in one of the Church of England's ancient cathedrals as part of celebrations to mark the 50th anniversary of the Apollo 11 moon landing.

Ely Cathedral joins Lichfield Cathedral in mounting a spectacular display to mark the anniversary of the lunar landing, with Lichfield's nave floor due to be transformed into a huge visual reproduction of the Moon's surface.

The cathedrals are among 14 church projects receiving a total of £70,000 in grants from the Scientists in Congregations scheme to foster greater understanding about science and faith.

Aspects of Faith in Lent

The Lent Gatherings at Bleddfa challenged us with unusual ways to look at faith. We meditated on music by Shostokovich and sang a hymn version of Stan Getz's "Take Five". We contemplated works of art, a simple small boat sailing past Holy Island or a smiling infant in a red chair for what they told us about the Christian journey: silence, joy, simplicity.

We shared favourite Bible passages, not the Beatitudes as expected, but the temptation of Christ. Jesus was vulnerable; he could be tempted like all of us.

We tried writing our own psalm in a simple way: one line at a time. This section of our psalm has a line from each of us.

In the darkness you are our light,
In the cold you are our warmth.
In the heat you are our cooling
spring of clear fresh water.

You are all that we need.

And we can only live forever grateful, sincere and emboldened by your nourishment. Without your nourishment we are as dry husks in the noonday, and we will perish.

Let us not perish for want of your cooling rain that descends like your love from Heaven.

Wash us in your purifying stream.

Finally in the session on Penitence we slowly read passages: *Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a right spirit within me.* (Psalm 51.10) We experienced mercy as we listened to a provocative John Taverner piece while gazing at the icon of Christ blessing shown on the left.



Good Friday Walk of Witness



Good Friday in Knighton was marked by 37 Christians processing through town with a large wooden cross on a day of glorious weather.

They met at Brookside Square by the War Memorial to hear again the Easter story of Jesus' arrest in the garden and his trial in Jerusalem from the gospels as read by Revd Michael Humphreys and Judith Dare. Revd

Kevin Dare led prayers for all people with some faith or none.

The Knighton Silver Band led the singing of Easter favourites: "There is a Green Hill Far Away," "My Song is Love Unknown," and "When I Survey the Wondrous Cross."

They carried the cross slowly up the hill to the Clock Tower were Revd John Hanna led our prayers and Rebe Brick and Jean Price continued the sad tale of Jesus' crucifixion. The Silver Band led us in "The Old Rugged Cross" and "Man of Sorrows."

From there we de-camped to the Knighton Methodist Church for hot cross buns. The annual event was organised by Churches Together, an ecumenical group including Baptists, Methodists, Anglicans and Catholics.

St Helen of Caernarvon

You may have noticed a network of old trackways on the map with the name *Sarn Helen. 'Sarn'* means a causeway, such as a Roman road, but who was Helen?

She is most commonly identified with Elen Luyddog, a Welsh princess, who married Magnus Maximus, Emperor of Britain, Gaul and Spain, and whose fortress was at Segontium, near Caernaryon.

An ancient version of the story is told in *The Dream of Macsen Wledig* in *The Mabinogion*. Eventually Macsen (Maximus) travelled to Gaul with all his Roman army and settled in Trier for a while. The tradition is that, while there, they became friendly with St Martin of Tours and Elen (Helen) was

greatly interested in the new monastic way of life that Martin was creating. After Maximus's defeat and death in 388 AD, Elen returned home with her two sons, Peblig and Custennin.

There are churches dedicated to Helen and her sons in both north and south Wales, most notably Llanbeblig near Segontium, where a Roman altar can still be seen in the churchyard.

The Mabinogion credits Elen with the construction of the roads, now known as Sarn Helen, which were built to connect the various Roman forts up and down the Welsh coast. But here we remember

her for her Christian faith and the founding of possibly the earliest churches in Wales.

Heart of Wales Line Trail Opens

We followed above the winding Ithon River to arrive at Penybont. We loved it, and many plan to walk the whole trail.

Lifts will be available back to Llangunllo. We hope that the brewery in New Radnor will be open to greet thirsty walkers while they await their lifts.





These concern the decline in local bus services and 'don't fear the smear'. For our August outing we hope to visit Stokesay Court for a tour and afternoon tea.

Mari Fforde from Clyro gave a fascinating talk about the American camp established just outside Kington in 1940. Wounded soldiers from

Dunkirk were brought there by train and transported in jeeps to the camp. In 1943 two major hospitals were built on the site, capable of taking 1000 wounded each, initially from D-Day. Mari was compiling a record of the site, with the help of Heritage Lottery funding, and she was able to contact several survivors or their family in the USA. A particularly moving find was a film made by Clarke Morgan and sent to Mari by his daughter. It showed the hospital on the Kington site, celebrations in Hereford on VE day, and finally the American soldiers' journey home to New York by ship. This film is now kept at the Imperial War Museum.

The site later became a training post for the British army, then a Polish resettlement centre, and more recently social housing. Mari is currently working on the Hay Castle project and promised to return to talk to us about that.





Maundy Thursday in New Radnor







They made their sandwiches for the next day before bedding down in their sleeping bags on the floor.



Recipe - Stuffed Red Peppers

Red peppers stuffed with feta and anchovies and drizzled with balsamic vinegar.

Ingredients

6 red peppers

400g (13oz) cherry tomatoes, halved

200g (6 1/2oz) feta, crumbled

3 slices rustic white bread, crusts

removed, cut into 1 cm (1/2 in) cubes

3 anchovies, chopped

2 cloves garlic, chopped

2 tbsp roughly chopped fresh basil

2-3 tbsp olive oil

2 tsp balsamic vinegar



Method

- 1. Heat the oven to 180°C (gas mark 4). Cut off the tops of the peppers and scoop out any seeds or pith with a spoon.
- 2. Put the rest of the ingredients in a bowl and mix gently to combine. Season with salt and plenty of pepper.
- 3. Fill each pepper with an equal amount of the mixture, place them in a roasting tin and bake for 35 minutes, or until they have softened and coloured. Replace the pepper tops about 10 minutes before the end of cooking.

Tip: If you prefer, slice the peppers in half lengthways and fill (as described) with the mixture, to give you 12 halves.
