Gladestry is a Place of Belonging

A village means that you are not alone, knowing that in the people, the trees, the earth, there is something that belongs to you. - Cesar Pavese Gladestry is a beautiful village. Unpretentious, even bleak in the cold winter months when the grey stone is as hard as the weather. One could be forgiven for thinking that not much goes on here but you'd be surprised!

The village hall, an amazing asset to the community, is a meeting place for the weekly Monday Pop-In cafe, children's parties, playgroup, Community Council, PCC meetings, Church Family Services, Bowls Club, W.I. and social gatherings. There is a second smaller kitchen area and showers sited at the back of the hall, once used by Gladestry football team, sadly long since disbanded.

Winter can be challenging, especially when it snows, but villagers pull together, gamely wielding a shovel to dig out a neighbour caught in a drift.

Spring is a very busy time for the farmers with lambing involving the whole family.

Summer - Last summer the village held a fabulous 'Gladestry in

Wonderland' Family Day with a successful Dog Show.

The Annual Sheepdog Trials in August draws competitors from all over the country and often from Europe. There's a refreshment tent where old friends swap yarns and laugh a lot.

Another annual August event is the Village Walk and Duck Race. An organised family walk is followed by a ploughman's in the hall after which everyone ambles down to the stream to watch the yellow plastic ducks' hurly burly progression to the finish. Some ducks arrive upside down, facing the wrong way, some get stuck in the weeds and need a helping hand, often from excited children with sticks, but all finish one way or another

Autumn. There are 10 names on the Memorial stone in the churchyard for the Two World Wars and every year a group of people whose uncle died in the Second World War, come to the Annual Remembrance. Last year, family members from as far away as Carlisle joined relatives of 'Uncle Huey,' Arthur Hewit Turner, a twenty two year old Gladestry lad and a dispatch rider in the Gloucester Regiment. He took a direct hit and is

buried in Belgium. Each year the W.I. lays a tray of crosses and poppies on the Memorial, one for each life lost.

In 2016, helped by sisters-in-law Margaret and Gill Lloyd, pupils from Gladestry Church in Wales Primary School planted daffodil bulbs on the village green to mark the 50th anniversary of the Aberfan tragedy. Now, each spring, the green is ablaze with beautiful daffodils in remembrance.

The Pop In Café has grown from two friends regularly meeting for coffee in the old post office cafe. When it closed, the group shifted to the village hall. It now meets every Monday morning at 10am to 11am; it is open to all and has a regular male contingent. Tea and coffee is £2. Any money left over is saved until a £100 target is met to give to charity. So far, over two thousand pounds has been donated.

W.I. meets on the third Tuesday of the month in the village hall with interesting speakers and visits to equally interesting places.

Short Mat Bowls meet October to March at the village hall 2nd and 4th Tuesday of the month. - Ann Dean

Bog Snorkelling, Pointe Shoes and Fur Balls

Following is an interview with the editor and our new priest, the Reverend Petra Beresford-Webb.

Where were you raised?

All over the place: England, Wales, Germany. (Father was in the military)

You speak Welsh. Are you a native speaker?

No. My mum was first language Welsh; she didn't learn English until she was 10. [Welsh was spoken in Petra's family home in Dolgellau.]

What did you do before you entered ministry?

I was Director of Music and Head of R.E. at Bedstone College. [During that time Petra headed up the "Bluesy Wolf" – a band and choir.]

What role does music play now in your ministry?

My music carries on. At fund raising activities at my previous parishes I would always sing or play my sax or both.

Did you have a special moment when you felt called to ministry?

It started when I was a child. When I was five I found a picture in a big supermarket in Germany. It cost too much for pocket money. When I insisted my father looked at it, it was of Jesus, and so I had it. It hung over my bed. I still have it.

When I was ten I thought I wanted to be a nun, but Sister Mary Mark said 'no.'

When I was sixteen I wanted to be a nun again, but I went to drama school instead.

The calling kept getting stronger. I was walking down a field and God was all around me and he finally opened up his arms and I couldn't get past.

When were you ordained?

In 2012 when I was a non-stipendiary curate at Knighton while continuing

to teach at Bedstone. Soon I was a full time curate. In 2014 I was licensed to the 12 churches [listed in last month's Radnor].

What was the biggest challenge in those twelve churches?

The hugest thing was trying to have my own space. There was so much to do and so many people I was trying to please. The learning curve was realising that in doing God's work you're not always going to please everyone.

All I had to do was slow down. Let God take the reins and follow him rather than running ahead by 100 yards.

What was the greatest joy?

There were quite a few: The people were wonderful. We had brilliant things like bog snorkelling at Llanwrtyd Wells. I'm going back to it this year because it's the first time we will be having a service in the tent.

Other things: the music. There were lots of different music people and groups to be involved with.

I enjoyed the fact that there was a new lesson every day. Not all of them nice, but that is what learning is about. I've certainly come back here a very

different person to the one who left. I'm not going to say that I've grown up; I'm not going to do that. I've increased in knowledge, tolerance and patience.

How do you unwind?

Horse Riding. I've not ridden for a while, but I've had a partial knee replacement, so I'll be getting back in the saddle again.

I have Simba and Hooh, the fur balls. Playing music: saxophone and piano. That is something I get a lot out of. I have new pointe shoes because I am determined to go back on pointe again. I did ballet years ago. "I'm gonna go for it!"

Do you have any dreams for your ministry with us?

I'd like to see a lot more collaborative ministry. Build the music up as well. There is a great musical tradition here and there are the people out there. We've just got to get them together, and get that music bubbling again.

Do you feel like you are coming home?

Yes. It just feels right. It is like getting into a nice warm shoe.

Tell me about the essay you are writing.

I'm working on a Masters in Canon Law: LLM (London Law Masters) through Cardiff University. I studied law when I was in my 20s but didn't complete. [After enquiring about this course on a clergy training day the leader said "You'll love it." Bishop John said, "I've done the course. You'll enjoy it." He was quite right. I've had a wonderful time picking over all the law of the Church in Wales and the history. In the essay I'm writing I'm looking at models of church and state working together in France, Spain and England. [Her Dissertation is due next December.]

Who would you like to be locked in a church with?

Jesus, absolutely. I could talk to him and I could pray with him. And he'd be all mine for that little bit of time.

Petra also tells us:

I've become engaged to Dr John Goodband. Please keep us in your prayers.

Cover - The Ascension - May 30

The Ascension on May 30 occurs forty days after Easter. It is always on a Thursday. For forty days the resurrected Jesus has met with the disciples, preparing a lakeside breakfast for them, walking with them and sharing bread, appearing in a room where they were gathered.

Finally he takes his leave and ascends to heaven, admonishing them to remain in Jerusalem to greet the coming of the Holy Spirit in ten days.

Next month's Radnor is a double edition.

The moment of Ascension was beautifully designed by Edward Burne-Jones and made in the workshop of William Morris in 1887 for St Phillips Cathedral in Birmingham.

Jesus is surrounded by angels, rising from blue clouds and gently offering the disciples below a sign of peace. The full window shows the disciples below gazing upward in awe and fear. It is said that Jones and Morris are depicted in the faces of two of those disciples.

The vibrant pre-raphaelite windows in the cathedral were wisely removed during World War II and kept safe in a Welsh mine shaft until peacetime.

Loneliness week - 17th to 21st June

Britain is in the midst of a loneliness epidemic. A survey by the Jo Cox Commission in 2017 revealed that nine million of us in the UK are affected by it.

So, no wonder that last year the Government even appointed the world's first loneliness minister, Tracey Crouch. And no wonder that the Marmalade Trust aims to raise awareness of isolation in the UK.

Loneliness hurts you physically as well as mentally. It has even been said that

it can be as bad for your health as smoking 15 cigarettes a day. It can raise blood pressure, and cause diabetes and obesity.

Technology is a big factor: we send emails rather than talk, we have virtual team workspaces rather than speaking in person. We use LinkedIn and Facebook to keep in touch. One health expert said, "We're getting out of the habit of actual conversations."

People who work from home and who also live alone can go days

without speaking to anyone. No wonder that the millennial generation, for whom technology accounts for an increasing percentage of their interaction, are reporting high levels of anxiety.

Experts advise that you simply try and make as many social connections as you can, however brief. Make tea for someone at work, or chat to your neighbour.

Bobby's Beat

Continuing series from the diary of one of our parishioners who served in the police.

Supporters were Plastered



In the 50s & 60s, the major London Hospitals had teams that took part in a rugby competition, which culminated in a cup final at Old Deer Park ground, at Richmond.

Following one final in 1960 or 61, a large group of supporters and maybe players, boarded two open lorries, and set off on a journey through Richmond, Petersham, Ham and Kingston. Their progress was followed by V Division Met Police, after a number of calls received from road users along the way. Innocent people were being bombarded with bags of plaster of Paris, which was

then doused with water from stirrup pumps.

Mass Arrest

The lorries were eventually stopped by one double manned patrol car and there followed the largest mass arrest, which may still be a world record. They were brought in to our station at Putney. All available officers were called in, and following form filling and fingerprinting, all were charged with conduct likely to cause a breach of the peace, and bailed by senior officers.

Next morning all the offenders appeared at South Western Stipendary Magistrates Court, in Tooting. They were ranged in groups of ten at a time at the back, and all pleaded guilty. They were duly dealt with by the "Old Beak", or "Weighed Oft" to use Police jargon.

Licensing Petra

The licensing of Revd Petra Beresord-Webb to the East Radnor Ministry Team was a celebration of Unity. Archbishop John insisted upon our working as a team with Petra and each other.

Our psalm [133] declared "Behold how good and pleasant it is to dwell together in unity." Archbishop John asked us to place Christ first and self second. Then with the prophet Isaiah [Chapter 12] we could shout and sing for joy.

Rejoice!

Our New Testament reading from Philippians 4 directed us to rejoice in the Lord. The Archbishop amused us by recalling a tiny congregation of grumpies unable and unwilling to rejoice or change, unlike the people of St Edward's who had removed pews to create a welcoming and useful space. He wished that all churches had such vision.

The Air Training Corps, which Petra had been chaplain to, dramatically led the whole procession in and out. Clergy from as far afield as the Gower attended along with Baptists, Methodists, and Catholics, all

Symbols and Meaning

Celtic Saint of the Month - Kevin of Glendalough – died 3rd June

Patron Saint of Blackbirds

id you know there was a saint called Kevin? In Irish his name is spelled Caoimhín, meaning "fair begotten", because he was of noble hirth

Glendalough means "the glen of two lochs" and is a most beautiful place with a fascinating array of ancient ecclesiastical remains. It was known as a monastic city and flourished for six hundred years. One of Ireland's famous round towers can still be seen there, many inscribed stones and crosses and the remains of seven churches. One is known as Kevin's Kitchen as its belfry looks like a chimney. Kevin had originally settled

in Glendalough to lead a peaceful eremetic life, but so many people wanted to join him that he had to make a hermitage in the woods to get some peace and quiet.

And what of the blackbird? Legend has it that one day when Kevin was praying with his hands outstretched, one hand was resting on the windowsill of his hut and a blackbird nested on it and laid an egg. Kevin was so touched that he refused to move his hand until the egg had hatched and the nestling had flown. Just one of many stories of Kevin's care for God's creation.







Gladestry W.I. And the "Uganda Dream"

The April meeting of Gladestry W.I. heard about the work of Midwives in Uganda. This is how it all started and where it has been going.

After being enthralled with a lecture about education in Uganda at Lingen Lectures 2016, Jane Roberts and Kay Pritchard asked questions about their health provision, both having health backgrounds, Health Visiting and Midwifery.

Jane had retired and had hankered after doing volunteer work for some time, Kay had ill health and retired after suffering ovarian cancer and all the treatment that entailed, but was eager to use her skills.

Immediately "Ugandan Dream" was formed and after fundraising events and sponsorship, they were amazed at local people's generosity.

In November 2017 both professionals volunteered at Kyaninga Child Development Centre and Kagote Midwife led unit respectively, just outside the Western town of Fort Portal on the Congalese border.

They took with them the monies raised so that it could be spent at ground roots level on relevant items. Their decision to buy 20 children's wheelchairs made in Uganda and since their return a further 10, a water filter for clean water to aid taking

tablets, a refrigerator for storage of immunisations among other things is having a great impact on mothers and children's lives. They also took 92 kgs of medical supplies including sutures and toys providing stimulation for disabled children, in their hold luggage.

Since their month long volunteering time, they have managed to continue sending support from here with any friendly traveller to the area.

Ugandan Dream is continuing fundraising in readiness for a further visit in late October 2019.

Flora and Fauna

Tune is the month that gives us so **U** much enjoyment: the changes as plants and flowers unfold all around us, the long light and warm evenings making us feel good and the first rose to excite all who love flowers. Tender plants that we have been taking care of indoors are now planted out and growing well. This month the sun is at its strongest; the soil will quickly dry out, so watering and feeding the plants will be one of the important tasks for June. Hanging baskets, containers tubs and especially need help to provide the glorious colour we expect from them this summer.

The Bearded Iris

One flower now becoming fashionable in larger gardens is the bearded iris, once restricted to white, blue and purple, but now available in

scintillating shades, light apricots, rich russets, caramel, pink, plum, every shade of yellow, baby to midnight blue and lavender. The rhizomes grow best in full sun, well drained soil; no month needs to be iris free. Names like "Celebration Song", "Stairway to Heaven", "Florentine Silk" and "Decadence", all with exquisite scent, a must-have flower which will add much drama to your garden. There are 300 Iris species; the national collection can be seen in Claire Austin's Nursery near Newtown.

Roses

Claire is the daughter of the famous rose grower, David Austin. Our lives are filled with references to roses. It is a symbolic flower shape found in heraldry and church windows. Many references are made in lots of works by Shakespeare. We too love roses in

the garden, delightful colours and many with a delicious fragrance, wide variations of sizes and shape. In flower arranging we are seeing a move back to looser, more natural designs with roses and peonies holding central interest, rather like Constance Spry, who became a leader in this type of arranging back in 1927. For competition work, rules still apply, balance, style, rhythm, texture, all important elements of good design.

The late Richard Wood loved his garden and all the little birds. Every year he awaited the arrival of the swallows and house martins and kept a note of the date. Ours have just arrived (May 10th), later than usual. Summer is on its way!

Recipe - Healthy Greek Couscous Salad

Ingredients

 $1\frac{1}{2}$ cups dry couscous (can use gluten free) 2 T olive oil

3 cups chicken or flavoured stock of choice 2 large tomatoes, diced

1 tsp olive oil

½ tsp sea salt

½ tsp dried basil

½ tsp dried dill

1 tsp garlic powder

pinch marjoram

1 large cucumber, diced

½ - 1 cup crumbled feta cheese

1/4 - 1/2 cup olives/semi dried olives

/sun dried tomatoes

Balsamic vinegar for topping (optional)



Instructions

- 1. In a large pot, add the stock of choice and on medium heat, bring to the boil.
- 2. Once boiling, reduce to a simmer and add the olive oil and sea salt and mix well. Add the dry couscous and allow to cook for 1-2 minutes before removing from the heat. Allow the couscous to sit for 5-6 minutes, until most of the liquid has been absorbed.
- 3. After the liquid has been absorbed, fluff the couscous with a fork and add the dried basil, dill, garlic powder and marjoram and mix very well. Stir through the olive oil until the couscous is coated.
- 4. Add the tomatoes, cucumber, feta and olives (and any other additions) and mix well until fully incorporated. Top with extra feta and drizzle with balsamic and olive oil.

Notes: Can be made in advance. (Pre-cook couscous and have the vegetables chopped. Mix when ready to eat. Can be eaten warm or cold. Keeps in fridge for 5 days, without feta. By Arman @ thebigmansworld
