Evancoyd's Lost Property

Olwen Morris and Nigel Waters have lived in the area of Evancoyd all their lives. Olwen's early years were spent at Northgate House, a sturdy stone and brick built property very much in the style of nearby Trappe House where Nigel used to live.

In talking about the area they told of two properties, Northgate Cottage and Corner House, at the crossroads of The Bush (Beggars Bush) which no longer exist because they were

demolished in 1965 to make way for widening the roads.

Incidentally Nigel's uncle owned the adjacent field and offered to allow the road to be re-routed there to avoid the demolition of these properties but this, sadly, was declined and the homes were pulled down.

The missing properties were Northgate Cottage whose last occupants were Archie and Alice Wilson and Corner House where Miss

Lizzie Tunley lived. She was housekeeper for a Mr. Ellerington who lived at Gardeners Cottage Evancoyd. By the side of her cottage was a large marker stone. This stone was on a ley line (as described by Alfred Watkins in his book "The Old Straight Track"), it was moved when the properties were demolished but I understand it is still somewhere nearby.

This photo shows Mrs. Bufton who lived at Northgate in earlier years, milking a cow on the roadside - before the days of fast traffic!

Another property close by in Evenjobb village was also demolished for road widening. This property, also confusingly known as Corner House, was a white rendered stone cottage. The only evidence today that this existed at all is a handful of ornamental trees including a lilac on the edge of the sheep field and a carpet of snowdrops in the spring. This was the residence of Edith and Walter Harris.

Probably the most enigmatic of all the houses was The New Seat, Evancoyd which was never completed but photographs at the time show the majestic outer shell of what would have been a magnificent dwelling. Now, nothing remains but a few mounds of grass covered stone on private land. This mansion was to be the new dwelling for Arthur Clinton Baskerville-Mynors but he sadly died in the Zulu War of 1879 and the project was abandoned. *Photograph courtesy of "The Lost Houses of Wales" by Thomas Lloyd.*

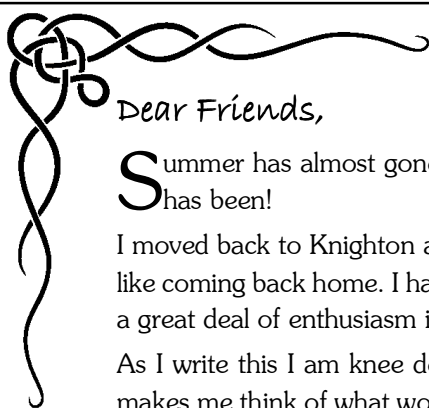

Cover - Archangel Michael Defeats Evil

That belief was based on the Book of Revelation, the last in the Bible. The archangel Michael leads God's armies in the war in heaven against the forces of Satan. He casts Satan out of heaven, to restore God's kingdom.

A big 'Thank you' to The Wharf for all the facilities and to John and Jen Bright for the use of their field.



From Holy Wells to Space Stations via the Road to Emmaus

It was a warm but not very sunny evening when, fingers crossed, we gathered round the table outside St Cynllo's for a gathering to celebrate our saint. Traditional ceilidh music set the scene for what was to be a service with a particularly light touch based on one used by the community on Iona.

We considered the differences between St Cynllo's world and the early Celtic church when ways of worshipping were more rooted in the environment and everyday life, based in people's homes and in the open air before parish churches and formal structure were widespread.


This simplicity was reflected in the way we made our communion with the bread and wine being passed round for each to share, having prepared ourselves with the readings from Corinthians about the origins of this reverent act of remembrance, and Luke about the Risen Christ on the road to Emmaus – recognised only when he broke bread.

We shared thoughts about the power of nature's calming and restorative powers, something our early ancestors must have known very well. We also considered that modern knowledge brings with it mixed blessings, wondering if it breeds a scepticism, which can be a hindrance to faith.

Following on from this, Mark, reminded in this anniversary week of the moon landing, commented that some people refused to believe even that actually happened. We had no such doubts as we marvelled at a recording of a lady astronaut playing a flute from the space station which was electronically somehow accompanied by The Dubliners here on Earth – a bang up-to-date kind of magic!

A very different service enjoyed by all, and even though clouds had begun to gather the rain kept off!

Where do children feel most lonely?

Children who grow up in the city are nearly four times more lonely than those who grow up in the countryside.

That is the finding of a recent official study into childhood loneliness. It found that 19.5 per cent of children in cities report 'often' feeling lonely, as opposed to just five per cent in towns or rural areas.

The Office for National Statistics also found that it could be linked to the fact that in the city, parents are more hesitant about letting children go out on their own.

As one doctor explained, "Despite easier access to people via social media, that doesn't seem to be helping in terms of loneliness. It emphasises the need for face to face contact and social support in a physical way."

Then the 16:00 from Llandod would have got us home at 16:30. However we decided to have a break in Aberystwyth and go for lunch. We caught the 15:30 changed at Llandod and got home at 18:20. Outside the door again!

So if you have a bus pass, use it!! We are now planning our next trip!! Somewhere on the south coast? Tenby perhaps?



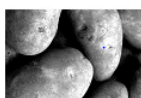

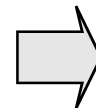

Medieval Life at Offa's Dyke Centre



Medieval Wales was celebrated with colourful re-enactments at the Offa's Dyke Centre over the weekend of 14th-15th July.

The Welsh division of Viking Re-enactments from Wrexham 'Cwmwd Ial' brought their extensive knowledge and artefacts to the fields behind the Centre: a Viking ship, ancient tools,

runic scripts, food, and scientific instruments of the day.

They came in costume and mingled with all the guests, much appreciated by the children. We saw how an axe head was made; we tried on Brythonic and Viking helmets. We held our breath during re-enactments of battles with shields, bows, long spears, knives, axes.

There was fascinating photography of Welsh castles and enclosures from the Radnorshire Society, lectures and a guided walk on the ancient Dyke.

We thank Clwyd Powys Archaeological Trust and the Offa's Dyke Association for this hands-on experience of the early Middle Ages in Wales.

In Memoriam - Roger Thomas 1947-2019

Roger was recently a Churchwarden at St Edward's Knighton and their bell captain in charge of many an important peal.

He studied farming and farm machinery at the Royal Agricultural College in Cirencester and then spent several years in Africa, chiefly in Swaziland where he built a training college for farmers with few tools, a lot of ingenuity and the help and respect of the locals. He stayed on to lecture at the university and work with the Swaziland Veterinary Service to eradicate foot and mouth.

When he returned to the UK in 1974 he served as a public relations man for

a tractor firm in Hampshire, volunteering with a group using tractors to dredge the Basingstoke canal.

He met Ali in 1982 and they married in 1984. They moved with the firm to Knighton where he later set up his own business, which he ran successfully for twenty-five years until retirement.

Roger lived life to the full, continuing his long-standing hobby of campanology (bell ringing), and handbell-ringing. He joined the West Midlands Bell Ensemble, taught handbells at Knighton Primary School for ten years, and set up the Clock Tower

Ringers here in Knighton. He was a governor at the Primary School, taking over as chairman for a while, and wound the clock on the church tower twice a week. He was also a keen gardener.

The family had canoeing holidays in France but later with Ali he visited his beloved Africa: South Africa, Swaziland, Namibia, Zambia and Malawi. This year he and Ali spent three enjoyable weeks touring Canada's maritime provinces. He loved the spectacular scenery and friendly people.

Llamas were the subject of our July meeting. Yvonne Parfett from Bucknell spoke about her life with these animals, who make excellent guard dogs and are long-lived. They are bred both for their meat and for their wool, which does not contain lanolin, unlike sheep's wool, and they do not have to be shorn every year. Llamas carry their young for eleven months and give birth according to the weather!

July also saw our outing to Radnor Hills Water at Heartsease. Members looked very smart in their high-vis jackets and blue haimets, ready for their tour of the factory. It was an interesting visit; we were impressed

with the drive to eliminate plastic and by the number of local community projects supported by the company.

Our August outing was to Stokesay Court, a most attractive Victorian manor house built in the 1880s by John Derby Allcroft, who made his fortune through manufacturing Dent's gloves. Interestingly, Thomas Harris, the architect, also built Bedstone College, as it is now called. In 1914 the Court was turned into a hospital for soldiers, and in later years hosted Girl Guide camps when the lady of the house was the Guides' Commissioner.

Recipe - Apple and Walnut Crumble

Ingredients

100g walnuts
1.25kg cooking apples, peeled, cored and finely sliced
50-100g caster sugar
1 teaspoon ground cinnamon (optional)

Method

Scatter the walnuts on a baking sheet and toast in an oven preheated to 180°C/Gas Mark 4 for 5-7 minutes, giving them a shake halfway through, until just beginning to colour and develop aroma. Leave to cool, then chop very roughly.

To prepare the crumble, sift the flour and salt into a bowl (or food processor) Add the butter and rub in with your fingers (or pulse briefly in the processor) until the mixture resembles coarse crumbs. Stir in the sugar, oatmeal and ground almonds, if using. Squeeze a few handfuls of crumble in your fist to make lumps - I reckon it's nicer to have a 'rocky' crumble than a fine, even-textured one.

Put the apples in a large bowl, sprinkle over the sugar (you'll need to estimate the amount according to the tartness of the apples). Add the walnuts and the cinnamon, if using, and mix roughly. Spread in a pie dish or other ovenproof dish, getting the fruit as compact as you can.

Scatter the crumble over the apples in a fairly even layer and bake for 40-45 minutes, until browned on top. Serve hot, with cream, custard or ice cream. Eat leftovers cold for breakfast, with thick, rich yoghurt.

For the crumble:

225g plain flour (can use any gluten free flour)
A pinch of sea salt
200g cold unsalted butter, cut into cubes
150g caster, granulated or soft brown sugar
75g medium oatmeal
75g ground almonds (optional)

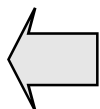



Ciarán of Clonmacnoise - 9 September

When you go to Ireland you must visit Clonmacnoise where you can see the remains of a monastic city, including seven churches, two round towers and several Celtic high crosses.

St Ciaran, one of the Twelve Apostles of Ireland, founded an abbey there c.545. It became one of the most influential monasteries in Europe. A cathedral was built around 900, but it was all destroyed in 1552 during the Dissolution of the Monasteries. An annual pilgrimage is still held there on 9 September, the feast of St Ciarán.

Ciarán was born c.516, the son of a carpenter and chariot-maker. Ciarán himself worked as a cowherd, but he was a bright boy and went on to study with Finian of Clonard and then Enda of Aran, who ordained him and advised him to found a church and monastery on the banks of the

Shannon in the middle of Ireland. Columba of Iona said, "He was a lamp, blazing with the light of wisdom." By his early thirties, Ciarán had achieved much in founding a Christian community with a great future, but unfortunately he fell ill with the plague and died c.549.

And it wasn't only the buildings and his relics that survived. When he studied with Finian as a young boy, he took his cow with him to provide milk for the community. When the cow grew old, its skin was made into vellum and was used for one of Ireland's most important manuscripts, *Leabhar na hUidhre* (*The Book of the Dun Cow*), which preserves the famous legend of the *Táin Bó Cúlainge*.

The image shows detail of one of the great high crosses known as the *Cross of the Scriptures*. It depicts Ciarán

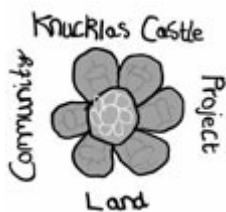

Why Ladies' Bedstraw Makes a Perfect Mattress
