The Castle Inn

The "Castle Inn" in the centre of Knucklas is said to date back to the seventeenth century, possibly built by Cromwell's soldiers. In those early days it was next to another pub, the Ship and Castle (see page 7).

The first official record of the "Castle Inn" is in the 1851 census, after which it changed hands roughly every ten years, and by 1881 George Deakins, who farmed 80 acres, owned the Inn. His wife, Margaret, was the daughter of Samuel Webb, who owned the "Ship and Castle". It remained in the Deakins family until the 1980's, when it was passed on to a relative, Pat Hughes and her husband, Ted, who did significant remodelling.

Ted moved the bar area to its current position and closed off the stairs there to the cellar below. [see photo on page 11] Servant girls had slept in the cellar which ran the length of the building. Ted added the present kitchen and converted the stables into a large function

room with five bed and breakfast rooms above. The building still retains original features: wood panelling, beams, shutters, iron fittings, flagstone floors (page 11).

Since the 1990's the "Castle Inn" has changed owners four times, but they have all kept the tradition of pub food, good ale, and village amenity. Over those years there have been darts teams, dominoes, open mic nights, quizzes, church dinners, local meetings, wakes, parties and folk nights linked to the nearby railway station. Occasionally the post office has run from the Inn.

During the pandemic Vince and Ying continued to offer takeaway. Much loved are Ying's homemade and authentic Thai meals. Walkers, workers in local firms, and tourists make use of the friendly accommodation, food, and access to the countryside.

Cover - St Hubert (c. 656 – 30 May 727 A.D.)

The legend of St Hubert hunting in a forest took place on a Good Friday morning. As he pursued a magnificent stag the animal turned and Hubert was astounded to see a crucifix floating between its antlers. A voice spoke: "Hubert, unless you turn to the Lord and lead a holy life you will go quickly down to Hell." Hubert dismounted, prostrated himself, and went to Maastricht where he renounced his former life and eventually became Bishop. He was known for his generosity to the poor, his prayers and fasting and his eloquence in the pulpit.

The image at Brinsop is paired with an image of St Francis who also loved animals. It appeared in Oct 2017 of The Radnor,

Hubert's story inspired hunters in Germany and Austria to develop a philosophy of ethical hunting: only shooting when a clean, quick kill was assured, only shooting old stags, euthanising a sick or injured animal, not shooting a female with young.



Inns in Knucklas (cont)

Ship and Castle: The "Ship and Castle" was first recorded in the Minutes of Radnorshire General Quarter Sessions in 1823. The "Ship" might well be a corruption of "sheep". Certainly both the "Castle Inn" and the "Ship and Castle" were named for Knucklas Castle. It has been closed for over 100 years, and is now Upper House, home to Lottie O'Leary, a stone carver who advertises with us. Upper House still retains the old fire range. By the 1870's this Inn had changed its name to the "Old Public".


Vavasor Powell connection: The "Ship and Castle" might have been the birthplace of Vavasor Powell (1617-1670), the firebrand preacher-reformer. He is said to have been born in the public house in Cnwclas (Knucklas), the son of an innkeeper and oatmeal dealer. He would have been baptised at St David's, Heyope. There is a Vavasor House in Knucklas and the Baptist Chapel, built in 1925, was dedicated to him.

No Decision on New Bishop

The College to elect a new bishop ended with no decision. The next Bishop of Swansea and Brecon Diocese will be chosen by the Bishops after the Church's Electoral College ended on 3 Sept without a result. No candidate was able to secure the necessary two-thirds majority vote of the College during its full three-day meeting at St Mary's Church in Swansea.

The decision will now be taken by the Bench of Bishops. The President of the Electoral College, Bishop Andy John, said the appointment would be high on the Bishops' agenda.

He said, "Whenever we have engagements like this and there is rigorous debate and close engagement, a decision is a very difficult thing to achieve. As the College hasn't come to one mind, it has asked the Bench of Bishops to take responsibility for the next appointment. So that is now very high on our agenda. We will be consulting together, both with the diocese and amongst ourselves, in the hope we can provide for the diocese someone who can take it forward. I am really confident that we will be able to do that soon."



My Favourite Thing - Stillness

St Mary's Church in New Radnor, is not the flashiest of churches. Its pews are rather old and battered. It has no wonderful stained glass windows to attract the eye. No stations of the cross adorn its simple white walls, only patches of damp attesting to its aged structure and the cost and difficulty of upkeep. You could say that it is rather austere in its lack of embellishments.

However, as you drive into the village up Church Street, it stands proud and bold on its high mound, keeping a watchful eye from behind its mantle of ancient yews. Sometimes its bells ring out calling the faithful and the not so faithful to prayer and reflection. I love to wander around its unruly churchyard, reading the inscriptions on the graves and thinking of the generations of villagers who have loved ones buried here. I love to push open the old blue doors and enter, alone, to enjoy the

silence and stillness within. I love to kneel at the chancel steps and just rest in silence bringing my concerns, my joys, my sorrows, my thanks to the Lord.

When I have finished, I love to sing. I cannot sing in tune. But the acoustics are wonderful and to my own ears, give my voice a worshipful resonance it does not have. Let me invite you, the next time you are passing, push open the door, pick up a hymn book, don't be shy, sing! It's better than karaoke.

As I leave, I wonder at the old 13th century effigies to the left of the nave, attesting to centuries of worship in this place. I look up at the balcony at the west end of the nave housing the organ and imagine country folk gathered there to hear the word of the Lord. I leave quietly and reflectively. To have time to enjoy this place; this is my favourite thing.





St Matthew Passion – "No under-scoring"

When I 'flew' to hear and see the performance of St Matthew from the Royal Albert Hall promenade season on 11 September, I had missed most of Part I in Bach's *St Matthew Passion*. It included a soprano recitative and aria, 'Although our eyes with tears o'erflow'. This was a poignant reminder of my own tentative rendering in a church in the past. I was filled with understanding in Part II (second soprano aria) when the accomplished singer seemed hesitant on a delivery of a top 'A' on the word 'nought' i.e. 'of sin he knoweth nought'.

I remembered as a young soloist not tackling a tricky 'accidental' in the body of an aria, 'O heart, melt in weeping' in *St John Passion* by J.S. Bach. I think we are forgiven.

In my singing life I have had many successful musical experiences and been variously described as a 'nightingale' and 'jackdaw'. I wonder if anybody in the community knows that they have an 'old bird' living amongst them.

Bobby's Beat | Bury Hill Again

From the diary of a parishioner who served in the police.

When I first went to Pulborough Tom and Les Adfield ran a British Rail parcel delivery



service round the villages. Tom was in his 80s, and Les the son was leader of the local St John Ambulance corps. They used two lorries, one an ex Army Thames, the other a verv Chevrolet.

As I showed an interest, and they told me the history. Tom's first lorry was a model T Ford, but it only had a gravity feed fuel supply. On market days he would pick up local folk to take them to Chichester with their produce, but half way up Bury Hill the carburettor would run dry, so he had to let the lorry run back, doing a "U" turn, and when the carburettor had filled, he could complete the climb over the hill.

Saint Levan, a Cornish saint who loved to fish [14 Oct]

I ave you ever been to the spectacular Minack Theatre, situated above the cliffs near Porthcurno, only a few miles from Lands End? If you continue west on the Coastal Path you will soon reach Porth Chapel. Climbing up from the beach you will come across St Levan's Well and further on, up some ancient stone steps, is St Levan's Church. This interesting old church, which has been modified many times over the centuries, was built on the site of St Levan's little 6th century hermitage.

Levan is short for Selevan, the Cornish for Solomon. He is said to have eaten fish every day, which he caught himself in the treacherous sea below his well. In the churchyard is a large boulder which Leven used as a seat to rest on after his fishing trips. One day he struck the boulder with his rod and it split in two. This boulder, which you can still see today, was used in earlier times for pagan worship, which may be the reason that

Levan built his church here, to show the people who gathered there a new and better way of worshipping God. There is a Celtic cross near the boulder and five or six others on the boundary of the churchyard, marking the ways that lead to farms and dwellings, symbols of God's protection.

Flora in October

Plants with glorious colour in the summer are showing glossy red hips, cones and attractive seed heads. Horse chestnut trees with satin smooth brown conkers gave many hours of pleasure to children in the past (no computers then).

Dahlias are still going strong with beautiful bright colours in exciting shapes. The second flush of roses are a real joy and the everlasting sweet peas, scabious, sunflowers, montbretia in orange and yellow, are all blooming well. Asters and Michaelmas daisies show a splash of colour: pale pink, lavender and blue with new mildew resistant varieties on sale. The National Collection of Asters is held at Picton Garden, Colwall near Malvern. Well worth a visit.

This month the drop in temperature will affect more tender plants: fuchsia, begonias and geraniums. Big is beautiful when it comes to choosing our spring bulbs, and every year growers introduce exquisite varieties.



Recipe: Sweet Potato Tikki

One of the recipes served at the Veg Pledge Launch Ingredients:

- · sweet potatoes 800g
- · ginger 4cm piece, coarsely grated
- · coriander a handful, finely chopped
- · coarsely ground black pepper ½ tsp · breadcrumbs 100g
- · 1/4 tsp dried chilli flakes (add a bit
- more if you prefer it spicy)
- · cumin seeds 1 ½ tsp, coarsely ground
- · cornflour 2 tbsp
- · vegetable oil for frying
- 1. Heat the oven to 190°C/fan 170°C/gas 5. Prick the sweet potatoes all over then bake for 40-45 minutes until tender. Cool slightly then halve and scoop the flesh out into a large mixing bowl.
- 2. Add the ginger, coriander, pepper, chilli, cumin and cornflour and mash everything together. Season with a little salt then divide into 20 cakes. Dip each cake in breadcrumbs and pat to stick. Chill for 20 minutes.
- 3. Heat 1 tbsp of oil in a non-stick frying pan over a medium heat. Add the potato cakes in batches and fry for 3-4 minutes on each side until light brown and crisp.

Charcoal Making Thanks to our successful Shropshire Hills the Conservation Fund, we took delivery of a charcoal retort and received training from the designer/retailer Hookway Retorts. We have chosen to use a retort over a traditional ring kiln as it produces very little particulate pollution and converts more of the timber into charcoal. The retort was simpler to set up and use than we anticipated. It produced practically no smoke, completed its burn by around 5pm. Next day we had very little "brown ends" (partially converted timber). Our experimental carbonisation of fern leaves in the top of the retort has also worked well. We sold our first bag of charcoal to a

volunteer at the training! The purchase and training are a huge step forward.

Castle Ring Wood Wildlife We had a wildlife bonanza at Castle Ring Wood. Finds included a Jay feather, some magnificent honeysuckle, a common toad, a pupa of a Magpie Moth (Abraxas grossulariata), a Stinkhorn fungus (Phallus impudicus) and an insect unknown to the author.

Hedgelaying If you would like to host a course and have a hedge suitable for laying (we can advise on suitability), please get in touch. Our training venue requirements are a suitable hedge, parking for 5 or 6 vehicles and access to a toilet – we provide everything else.

harvest produce.


They and their tractors crowded into the front and stayed happily for the whole service, to-ing and fro-ing and joining in,



Ton up for the Church in Wales (cont)

(continued from last month – when the Church in Wales was disestablished in 1920.)

As a dis-established Church the Province would not have any Bishops sitting in the House of Lords; one effect of this meant that clergy in Wales could stand for Parliament; English clergy cannot do this because of the Bishops representing them in the House of Lords.

The fact of Dis-endowment which meant that the ancient Endowments were confiscated from the Church and vested in the County

Funded the National Museum

Councils meant that clerical stipends in Wales were reduced by

anything up to 30 or 40%. This endowment money was entrusted to the County Councils for Educational or National purposes: Glamorgan used its share to build the National Museum, Ceredigion built the National Library. The other Counties pooled their resources which became the Welsh Churches Fund. This is still in existence, giving grants to listed or important buildings in need of restoration.

Another change meant the abolition of Private Patronage. Universities and Colleges as well as individuals had the historic right of appointing clergy to particular parishes. From 1921 onwards appointments were made by the Provincial Patronage Board, the Diocesan Patronage Board or the Bishop. This is all spelt out in the Constitution of the Church in Wales which was beginning to be produced at that time. This new Province was completely independent although it was only later that it gained power to produce new forms of service for the Church in Wales. Financial help from the Church Commissioners was no longer possible, and money had to be borrowed at first in order to stay solvent.

There were many changes including the Church in Wales flag. The flag of St. David is a black flag with a gold cross. The unofficial flag of the Church in Wales became the reverse of this, a gold flag with a black cross. This remained until 1954 when the present official flag shown on page 12 was adopted – a white flag with a blue cross with a golden Celtic cross in the centre.





The rhododendron bushes have flourished and on Tuesday 16 November we will be pruning them, trimming the hedge on the western boundary (it was laid about 4 years ago) and improving the compost bins.

Some of the grass we scythed in August this year was scythed again and then removed by Fiona and David Gomersall who have moved close by. They are using the cut grass with the seeds it contains to help increase the diversity of plants on their own pasture. Fiona led a walk on Castle Hill Knucklas in June this year.

If you fancy some exercise join us on November 16.

The work is all voluntary, but between Bobby and Adrian and The Beacon Hill Benefice we pay Caring for Gods Acre £100 for every work day, to guide us and provide the tools used in the management of Churchyards.
