Cover - The Last Super

The Votive Church, the second tallest church in Vienna, was built in 1879 in gratitude for an unsuccessful assassination attempt on Emperor Franz Joseph. As the Votive Church was nearly destroyed in WW2, the windows are post war. They are brightly coloured, many with Austrian characters in native costume.

Here the top panel shows a typical Austrian village with onion dome church, arable fields, four grain silos, and the Alps behind. The main image is of Jesus administering Holy Communion to disciples intensely gathered round. Each has a unique personality: questioning, curious, devout. Below and in front of the Communion table is an evil looking Judas counting money. He was the keeper of the communal purse and was paid 30 shekels for turning in Jesus to the authorities.

Welsh Words

Mihangel - Michael

Michael is a Hebrew name which means "Who is like God?" the "el" bit at the end is a word for God.

Mihangel is interesting as it contains the word "angel", which is Welsh for "angel", though it is pronounced differently, with a short "a" and a silent "g" as in "banging".

Llanfihangel - Michael's Church (notice that the "m" of Mihangel has mutated to "f" after Llan)

Llanfihangel-nant-Melan is Michael's Church by the Melan brook. Melan can mean steel, but I don't know if that is the meaning in this case.

Llan can mean churchyard, village, enclosure as well as just church, so you could call it Michael's Village by the Melan Brook.

SAINT MICHAEL 29TH SEPTEMBER

If you come across a church situated on an eminence with a roundish churchyard dedicated to St Michael, it is more than likely to have been founded by the Early Medieval Celtic Christians.

Here, in and around Radnorshire, we have several such churches, some guarding Radnor Forest where it is said that the last dragon of Wales is sleeping.

In our ministry area we have Cascob, Beguildy and Llanfinhangel Nant Melan. Nearby are Dolau, Cefnllys and Discoed, with Stowe across the Teme in England.

What is the connection between St Michael and dragons? Well, Michael isn't really a saint, he is an archangel. Michael is mentioned several times in the Bible, famously in Revelation 12: 7-9, "Then war broke out in heaven. Michael and his angels battled against the dragon . . .

The huge dragon, the ancient serpent, who is called the Devil and Satan, who deceived the whole world, was thrown down to earth."

The early Celtic Christians were very aware that they were in a spiritual battle between good and evil and Michael was their champion and protector of their churches. There are churches dedicated to St Michael on high hills and mountains all over the world. You may of have heard of Mont St Michael and St Michael's Mount, but how about Skellig Michael off the coast of County Kerry?

Above the sheer cliffs are the remains of a 6th century monastery, which you can still visit today if you are brave enough.

It is the most westerly outpost of Celtic Christianity, over 7 miles from the mainland, out in the Atlantic ocean.

Blood Bikes Wales

Ray Rand is the Area Rep. for Powys, and kindly gave New Radnor W.I. an in depth talk about the volunteers who give up their time to run the service Blood Bikers.

Blood Bikers were originally established in England in 1962, it wasn't until 2011 that the group started up in Wales. We were all surprised to hear that it was not until 2018 that the Blood Bikers began in Powys becoming part of the National Association of Blood Bikers (NAB). Today, Powys' Blood Bikers is the second busiest group in Wales, Wrexham being first.

The service has won the Queens award for Voluntary Service and has also been awarded The Welsh Charity Award.

The service does not receive financial support from the Government unlike the Air Ambulance, NAB is funded solely by donations from business patrons and members of the public, volunteers often collect outside supermarket's and attend local shows where possible.

Currently Powys Blood Bikers have 24 motor bikes, which are based at Rhayader, and the riders have rigorous training to ensure they are competent on the highway and the different techniques required when transporting their life saving and vital cargo: -

- 1) Blood in all its forms.
- 2) Human milk (which is vital at special units for premature babies as it is essential for the development of their frail immune systems)
- 3) Sometimes potentially DANGEROUS bio matter!

We were interested to learn that all their deliveries are free to the NHS.

Occasionally riders encounter thoughtless drivers, but most (not all) give way when they see the vivid yellow cycling clothing and helmet.

Night deliveries are a greater problem because other road users cannot see that the bike behind is on an important journey. Ray is making enquiries about the possibility of being permitted to attach the "Green Lights" system, currently used by Paramedics and Doctors at night.

RECIPE OF THE MONTH

Parsnip, Apple and Lime Loaf Cake

The first frosts of winter should soon be with us – climate change allowing - so locally grown parsnips should soon be plentiful. They are usually harvested after the first hard frost because it improves their flavour.

Ingredients

For the loaf cake

- 180g plain flour
- ½ tsp bicarbonate of soda
- ½ tsp baking powder
- ½ tsp cinnamon
- ½ tsp ground ginger
- ¼ tsp salt
- 2 large eggs
- 90g soft light brown sugar
- 90g castor sugar
- 160ml sunflower oil
- ½ tsp vanilla essence
- 180g grated parsnip
 - (2 medium parsnips?)
- 150g peeled and cored apple (2 small granny smiths), in
- zest of 2 limes (save the limes for garnish)

For the icing: 180g icing sugar and 40ml lime juice

Method

Preheat oven to 160°C fan (180°C) and line a small loaf tin (about 1kg capacity, 20 cm x 10cm) with baking paper. Sift the flour, bicarbonate of soda, baking powder, cinnamon, ginger and salt in a medium bowl and set aside.

In a separate large bowl, whisk the eggs and sugars until combined, then add the oil. Continue whisking until creamy. Add the sifted dry ingredients in three batches, mixing lightly with a rubber spatula until almost combined (there should still be flour visible), then fold in the vanilla, parsnip, apple, and lime zest. Mix until just incorporated, then scrape the mixture into the prepared loaf tin.

Bake for about 60 minutes, or until a skewer inserted into the middle comes out clean. Remove from the oven and rest on a cake rack for 30 minutes before lifting onto a cake plate to cool completely.

While the loaf is baking, prepare the lime icing. Measure 40ml of juice and whisk into the icing sugar to make a smooth icing. When the loaf has cooled completely, drizzle over the icing and allow to settle for a few minutes; it won't set hard but will form a glaze. Enjoy!



The Fforest Inn

The exact age of The Fforest Inn is unknown, from a map dated 1548, we can be confident it is well over four hundred years old. Initially constructed as a Drovers Inn, the Fforest is a traditional Welsh longhouse.

Originally the building operated with three key sections; the main pub, the barn for overnight housing of more valuable livestock (now the restaurant), and a forge where horses and cattle were shod for their lengthy walk to market, often as far as London. Fields around the building were also owned by the pub and used for accommodating the less valuable livestock.

Its high altitude, and resulting extreme weather, meant it was regularly regarded as an opportune sanctuary. Over the centuries many have found themselves stuck in heavy snow and been grateful for its warm welcome and sustenance.

Indeed, a fictional novel was written by local author HLV Fletcher in 1946 based on the pub. Called **The Forest Inn** and set just after the Battle of Waterloo, it tells the tale of a mail coach carrying gentry getting stuck in the snow and its passengers staying the night - a story of thrills, intrigue and even "arguably" murder.

The inn is also at the centre of the famous local legend of "Silver" John Lloyd. A regular at the inn, Silver John was a kind local sheep farmer famed for his bone-setting skills. Not wanting to be paid for his services, offerings of thanks were given in the form of silver treasures such as buttons, buckles, and a much-prized walking stick.

He soon became famous for his heavily laden sparkly attire and became affectionately known as "Silver John the Bonesetter". One night he was travelling home from a Michaelmas fair in Builth Wells in his horse drawn cart. But the horse and cart arrived home alone. Despite a thorough search Silver John could not be found.

Early the next year at the Radnor Candlemas fair, which was held on Lynheilyn (behind the inn), Mary, the daughter of the landlord was skating on the lake. She fell and screamed. There frozen into the ice and looking up at her was the corpse of poor Silver John.

The locals waited for the lake to thaw before attempting to remove him, which took several weeks. When they were finally able, Silver John was recovered minus his coat and silver treasures. Sadly, it became evident he had been murdered for them. The grass is said to be always green on the slopes of Harley Valley where his body was laid to rest.

Tom and Win Lander, landlords from 1956 to the mid-1970s made several changes. The bar was revamped with mahogany panelling from a bank, and the wainscoting in the restaurant came from a chapel in Birmingham. Today the beer mats at the bar are being replaced with handmade mahogany trays

Sitting on the Builth Wells junction of the A44 in Llanfihangel Nant Melan, the Fforest is a humble little pub. While ensuring the pub offers modern comforts, the current landlord was keen to stay honest to its roots and maintain its modest, homely atmosphere. Offering traditional pub food, all produced inhouse, The Fforest still continues to be a perfect place for friends and family to meet and enjoy each other's company.





The Flower Arranger's Garden (September):

The days are shortening and a nip is in the early morning air. Before the leaves crisp and the sap stops rising, it is not too late to preserve foliage with glycerine ready for your winter arrangements.

Hydrangeas are almost at a perfect state for preserving in September. I dry them off quickly in a jug of water and they keep their colour for years — most attractive in displays.

There are so many interesting seed heads, which can be collected on a dry day. These too are ideal for arranging and can be coloured with some of the delightful sprays available today.

This is the best month for taking cuttings of geraniums and hydrangeas but they must be protected over the winter. Sweet peas can be planted as well as hardy annuals sown outside.

For the arranger, September provides useful, trailing ground cover plants like arum (pictum), bugle, elephant's ears, euonymus, geranium (grandiflorum), pachysandra, periwinkle and thyme. They need to be planted now. Those that produce runners are the most useful of all as they can trail gracefully down in a pedestal arrangement. Ivy deserves a mention for flower work.

The Shrewsbury Flower Show this year was a wonderful showcase of everything for the gardener and flower arranger; magnificent displays of vegetables and flowers; brilliant colour and the loveliest scent from sweet peas and David Austin roses.

The winner for me was the enormous stand of perfect chrysanthemums in every colour imaginable. The floral art marquee had clever and exciting exhibits with helpful comments by the judges.




NGS Open Gardens at Evancoyd Court
