In Remembrance of Joyce Matthews.

(Abridged eulogy by Rebe Brick)

Joyce Matthews was born in 1931 at The Heath, Dutlas. After her mother died, her four sisters were split up and Joyce stayed at The Heath with her Grandparents. She walked, rode her pony or cycled the 3½ miles in all weathers to Llangunllo School. In 1948 she married George Matthews at Beguildy Church; their children were David, Glenda and Megan. She was a valued helper at St. Peter's Church, Crug-y-byddar, and after it closed, she continued by helping at Beguildy Church. At Felindre Village Hall she cleaned and polished the parquet floor until you could see your reflection. She organised sponsored walks for Charities, often over her beloved Beacon. As a school transport driver, she ferried children down narrow lanes. As a hands-on Granny to Sue, Chris, Dan, Jess, Rhian, Angharad & Hywel, she had sleep overs, family picnics on The Beacon, and Christmas shopping. Later she did the same for great grandchildren. After the sudden death of George in 1992 Joyce rebuilt her life with days out and by travelling with friends to Egypt, Scotland, and Monaco. She served as an officer for Felindre WI and the local federation. She was their avid short mat bowls player. She was the star of the show in the comedy sketches at the annual WI Concert. And who could forget her scotch pancakes? Joyce was a constant and will be greatly missed. The family thank the Macmillan Nurses, Severn Hospice and the District Nurses in Knighton.

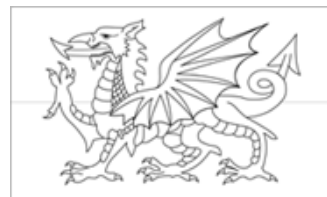
Tachwedd means Slaughter. November was the month of slaughtering the animals that couldn't be kept over winter.

Llangunllo – Snippets of the Past.

Buried Treasure! In 1804, a considerable quantity of gold coins of the reigns of Edward 11 and Henry 1V were found at Noyadd Fach. It is thought the coins were buried due to the approaching army of Owen Glyndwr in 1402. Their concealment was never disclosed as probably the owners met their deaths, either in the skirmishes that preceded the great Battle of Pilleth, or in the field of battle itself. Many silver coins of the reigns of Elizabeth 1, James 1 and Charles1 were also discovered at Malygoed and it is stated were sold in London for 100 guineas.

Drunk in Charge of Horse! PC Pugh of Llangunllo reported in January 1894, a certain Abraham Hamer of Llanbister was charged with having been drunk in charge of a horse on his way to the village. Mr Hamer fell from off the horse and was picked up by a witness who also took the horse into a stable where it remained until Mr Hamer was sobered. He did not appear in court, sent a friend to plead guilty on his behalf, and was fined 2s 6d and costs.

Housing Report!In 1899 the visiting Inspector reported that he had found the parish in a very satisfactory condition. The houses were very clean, but some of them were damp, and the water supply was good with a few exceptions. There were four or five houses with defective drains, but the general state was very good for so large a parish. The vicar, Rev J Evans, responded "Hear, hear for Llangunllo!"

Llangunllo tractor run

The first ever tractor run to be held in Llangunllo was a huge success. Starting from Lea Hall farm by kind permission of the Duggan family. A large crowd gathered to enjoy bacon rolls, coffee and a chat. A varied selection of over 60 tractors from the small quaint vintage to the large modern tractors together with the occasional 4 x 4 set off and what a wonderful sight they made as they departed on the sunny autumn morning. The 30 mile course took the drivers up hills and down dales through the occasional water splash pausing occasionally to admire the view and for the more inquisitive driver to enquire

"Who's is that farm over there?" The convoy eventually arrived back at Llangunllo at 3.30pm where the drivers were refuelled with a hearty lunch in the village hall. A huge thank you to all our sponsors and all those that helped make this event a success. A large sum of money was raised for the Air Ambulance and the Village hall.



The Centenary of Llangunllo War Memorial.

Llangunllo War Memorial stands at the roadside in the centre of the village and this year marks the centenary of its dedication ceremony, led by the Bishop of Swansea, in November 1922. The land upon which the memorial stands was donated by Mr W S Bryan of Crungoed and local subscriptions raised £215 18s 7d (near £13,700 today) to fund its construction. It is made of Portland stone, in the form of a pillared cross, inset with a sword of sacrifice. The cross stands on a three stepped base and was designed by a local architect, Mr Shrimpton. Two plaques are on the front face of the column with the first reading "IN THE GLORY OF GOD AND IN MEMORY OF THE BRAVE MEN OF THIS PARISH WHO LOST THEIR LIVES IN THE GREAT WAR 1914 – 1918 REST IN PEACE and names are listed by rank, forename, surname and residence. The second plaque is for World War 11. Llangunllo community lost seven men in WW1 and one in WW2. Those killed in action in World War 1 are buried in the military cemeteries of France (Lance Bombardier William Deakins aged 28 and Private Joseph Watson aged 20) and Belgium (Driver Edward Poole aged 29), and if no known grave, remembered on the Memorials of LOOS (Corporal John Pryce Lloyd aged 27), ARRAS (Corporal Arthur Price age not given) and the MENIN GATE (Private David Isiah Lloyd aged 24). In 2006 Knighton Town Silver Band had the honour of playing at the Menin Gate where each evening "The Last Post" is sounded. Of Lance Corporal Robert Deakins no further information is currently available. The Lloyd brothers were killed on the same day, 25th September 1915, in different theatres and Edward Poole, having emigrated to Australia in 1913 returned to Europe to fight with the Australian Field Artillery, died on 8th October 1917 in Belgium. William Deakins and Arthur Lloyd were both awarded the Military Medal and Edward Poole's medals were awarded posthumously. In World War 11, George Reynolds was killed in 1942, aged 31 and is buried in RANCHI WAR CEMETERY, India.

Rachael had an amazing display of her own needle felted creations; sweet little cottages; Gingerbread men; aliens visiting the Nativity with baby Jesus in his manger and a Scary Fairy looking on; an excellent Shetland donkey and a life sized, absolutely beautiful Blue Tit, and many, many more. 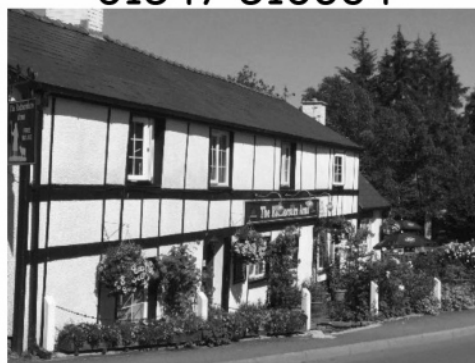

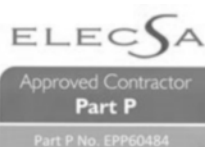

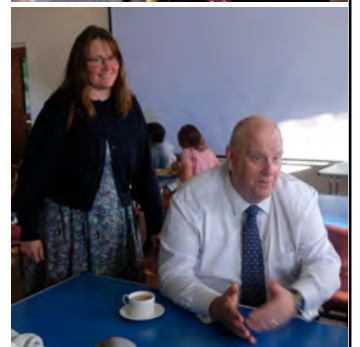

LLANGUNLLO WI INVITE BLOOD BIKES WALES

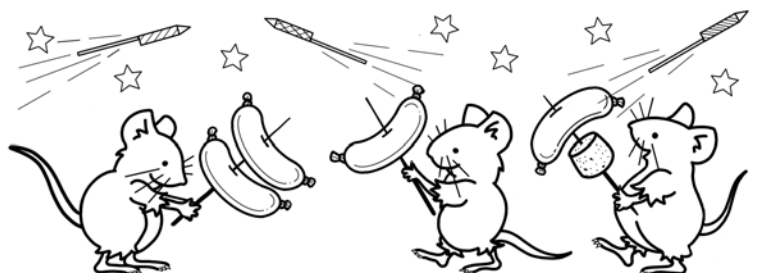

St Illtud of Llanilltud Fawr 6 November - Saint of the month

Illtud is one of Wales's best loved saints and there are lots of stories about him, but how do we know who he really was? Have you ever been to Llanilltud Fawr (Llantwit Major) in the Vale of Glamorgan? The name means Illtud's Big Church Enclosure and it is where Illtud built a church, a school and a monastery around 500 AD. One of his pupil's was Samson, who later succeeded him as abbot, and in the church you can see Samson's Cross. It is an ancient Celtic cross shaft with the inscription, "Samson placed this cross for his soul" and on the reverse "Illtud, Samson the king, Samuel, Ebisar." This is the earliest mention of Illtud, but we learn a lot more from The Life of St Samson, written by a Breton monk who took his job very seriously and interviewed lots of people. He writes that Illtud was the most accomplished of all the Britons, being well versed in the Old and New Testaments, as well as every type of philosophy, including geometry, rhetoric, grammar and arithmetic. He was also "gifted with the power of foretelling future events", which was a well-respected gift in ancient Welsh culture. As well as Samson, his pupils included Gildas and Paul Aurelian and perhaps even St David. There are many memories and legends about St Illtud. It would fill the whole magazine to tell you them all. In the meantime, why don't you visit his church, or spend a week walking the splendid Illtud Walk through south Wales. - Rosemary Hanna

Read Easy

Helping adults learn to read

Since Read Easy Shropshire Hills formed in early 2019, we've enrolled 24 Readers on our free, one-to-one coaching programme and of those, six have completed all five Turning Pages manuals. However, we don't measure success by how many achieve this, as Readers can reach their potential at other points in the programme.

Some Readers have moved away from the area, others struggled to find time with busy work and family commitments, or found it difficult to keep going during the pandemic. We have however only had one Reader for whom our phonics-based approach proved to be ineffective. When Amana, our Coordinator, sees that a Reader is struggling we always look for different ways to help them move forward, but if there is no progress, we give advice about alternative activities and support for their reading.

We can provide a free tablet which is set up to be usable by anyone who wants to learn online. It needs no prior knowledge of IT or keyboard skills as the Reader and Coach are connected at the touch of a button. Really, all you need is WIFI and you can learn to read at home.

All of our readers are introduced to us by a relative or someone they trust from organisations such as Social Services, Jobcentre Plus, the NHS and other local support agencies. If you're involved with an organisation where you know you come in contact with people who struggle with reading and you would like to find out more about our free service then please get in touch with Finn from our networking team on 07890 261380 or email her at shnetworkers@readeasy.org.uk. As the number of readers increases, we need another voluntary Coordinator to work alongside Amana. She describes it as the most rewarding job at Read Easy: she gets to see how life changing learning to read is, watching Readers grow in confidence and go on to get better jobs. A Coordinator helps pair up our reading coaches with local people who struggle with reading and provides ongoing support to these reading pairs. If you have good literacy and people skills and you want to make a real difference to the lives of local people this could be the role for you. 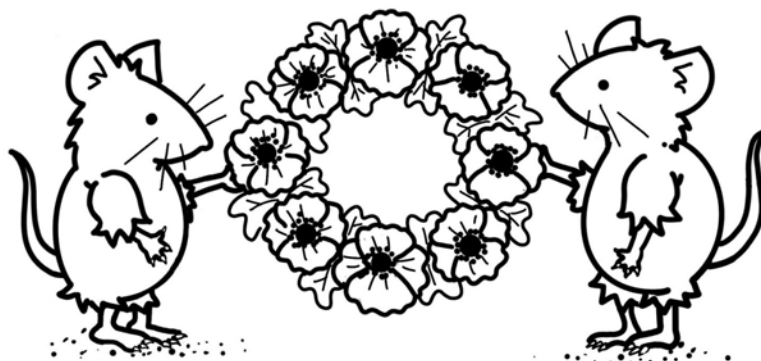

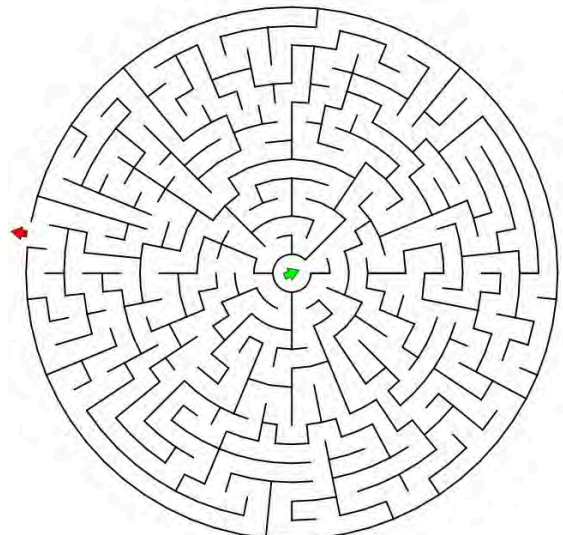
