Easter at Llangunllo

We snuggled into the warm and intimate choir stalls for our Easter Communion led by Rev Rachael. Once St John's story of Jesus' resurrection was read, we pondered it with the aid of meditative music, "Solitude on the Mountain" by Bull. The music prompted us to consider that early morning scene when Mary Magdalene looked into an empty tomb, when in distress she queried the gardener, "Where have you laid him?" The simplicity of Jesus's simple word, "Mary" and her equally simple but profound "Rabboni" (Teacher) spoke volumes. That serenity was broken by two disciples racing to the tomb.

We carried that sense of God's presence into Communion when we eavesdropped on the blessings given to young children: "May you help your mother and keep your bedroom tidy." At the end of the service Rachael's final words were "Blessings for all of you, and for those with children – Fortitude." An honest service with quiet and humour and homemade refreshments!

Dear Friends,

The Season of Easter continues up until Pentecost on the 28th May, though many think it ends after the celebrations of Easter Day. Through the first two-thirds of this month, Christians will continue to celebrate the gift of new life.

One of the greatest messages that comes from the Easter story is that the possibility of a new start is ours for the taking. There are all sorts of reasons why this might be helpful. Perhaps our lives feel as if they are in a rut; maybe we are burdened by guilt for something we have or haven't done; possibly we feel as if our life is going in the wrong direction and we need to take a different pathway. Or it could be that a relationship has broken down or we are having to learn to live without a beloved partner, relative or friend who has died or we feel lonely or our ageing body means we have to begin to look at life in a different way.

The Easter story gives us hope that things can be different. The image of God overpowering death through the resurrection is a vivid one, from which those who believe take heart. Resurrection is at the heart of the Christian faith, but it is not always easy for people to believe in it, until they have experienced the abundant life God gives for themselves. In God's kingdom, what counts are things such as life, mercy, joy, justice, peace, care for others, generosity, kindness, loyalty, dignity, forgiveness and so on. Most people believe in these values, even if they are not practising Christians. If we all managed to live with them at the heart of our lives, the world would be a much better place. Many of these attributes are what enable people to take hold of a new start when they need one, either for themselves or when they walk alongside others in need of beginning again.

Can we offer that hope to someone today? Can we allow ourselves to believe that we can begin again? It's not always easy but it's never too late to start the next adventure or chapter of our lives.

The banner above the angel reads "While he blessed them he was parted from them." The full window shows the disciples gazing upwards at Jesus rising to the heavens with an angel on either side. It was produced for by an eminent firm, Shrigley & Hunt, in 1918.

Community people read gospel accounts and narrations which filled in the thread of real family life for Mary.

We were pleased to welcome newcomers to the church and to have John and Rosemary Hanna with us, Rosemary on the organ and Rev John on the guitar. When the children had finished their cards, they passed them out to every woman in church. To finish their efforts the children formed a choir to sing "Jesus love is very wonderful" with the variation "Mummy's love . . ."

Local Boy Writes Home.

In Spring 1918, the Brecon Radnor Express, reported on a Llangunllo boy's visit to Mesopotamia (present day Iraq) as a serving soldier of World War 1.

Gunner H L Vaughan, son of Mr and Mrs Vaughan, Clogy Farm, landed in the country in October 1917, after two months at sea and rather disappointed to have not seen any submarines during the voyage.

He writes "Since landing we have been pushed forward up the line very quickly, consequently, I have seen a good deal of Mesopotamia in a short time."

He thinks it a very strange country, quite different to England, with no beautiful green fields and hedgerows and practically one wide stretch of desert. He does, however, mention the plantations where dates, limes, pomegranates and other fruits are grown, fenced in by high walls of mud and stone.

He tells his parents the inhabitants consist of Arabs, Armenians and possibly some Jews, and mentions in detail the "difficult to contend with" climate of hot days, cold nights and dust due to lack of rain. He goes on to say the dust on the roadways, in some places a foot to eighteen inches deep, is very unpleasant for troops on the move, but they are getting used to it.

Working alongside Indian troops, referred to as "natives," he is quickly picking up their language and, at present, is living with comrades in an old Arab house, formally an inn, undertaking a course of training in sanitation and purification of water.

He concludes his letter by assuring the family he is in good health, wondering what he will have to eat for Christmas Dinner and looks forward to when he is back at home and with all his friends in dear old Radnorshire, under better and happier circumstances.

Gunner Vaughan returned to "dear old Radnorshire" and the family later moved from Clogy to Great House Farm, Llangunllo.



Poor Old Dad working under instructions from Petticoat Regiment. Sawing firing and hauling coal.


May15th 1990


Mother and Boss gone to Hereford shopping. (Once again) I wonder is 'Boss' young Liz?







Greenhouses, windowsills, and every available space is full of young seedlings eager to get out into the soil. For those without a garden, the garden centres now have a huge choice of containers (all sizes) ready planted with attractive displays, lots of colour ready to go. They too have so many herbs in pots, for use in the kitchen or displayed on a sill. As we look forward to warmer days ahead, let us enjoy the pleasures of the spring garden.



Celtic Saint of the Month

In 689\$, Saint Indract and his sister St. Dominica, of Irish royal birth, landed near this spot. The Holy Well is at Greenbank nearby. St. Dominica's Parish Church - two

miles inland - in the village of St. Dominick, dates from the 13th.

century.

The people who built this chapel a couple of hundred years a go seemed pretty certain who Indract and his sister Dominica were, but unfortunately the most ancient records are lost. The earliest mention we have of him is in the mid-11th century Leominster Litany, for some obscure reason. Indract (or Indrechtach in Irish) and his sister were children of an Irish king. They sailed around Cornwall and landed at Tamerunta (now Tamerton Foliot) close to the confluence of the Tamar and the Tavy. They must have crossed over into Cornwall as their names are recorded in villages and church dedications west of the Tamar.

So far so good, but the different versions of Indract's life all claim he was killed by Saxons in Somerset and this is why Glastonbury claim him as one of their saints. Evidently he and his companions had visited Rome and were heading for Glastonbury (the British "Rome"). When they reached Huish Episcopi, a follower of the local king thought they were carrying

valuables and killed them all. Actually they were carrying parsley and other seeds to take to Ireland, and their staff tips were made of brass, not gold. The king saw a bright light that night and recovered the bodies and took them to Glastonbury for burial.

Although Glastonbury claimed Indract as one of their own saints, we can't prove that any of this was true. But there was definitely an Indrechtach who was abbot of Iona, though he lived a hundred years later than the stories that came out of Glastonbury claim. This Indrechtach took the relics of St Columba to Ireland in 848, to save them from the Vikings, who did a lot of ravaging of monasteries. This Indrechtach is also said to have been martyred by the Saxons while on a pilgrimage to Rome. So you can take your pick as to what to believe, but the Cornish on the west bank of the Tamar definitely claim him as one of their own.

Open the Book: The Last Supper/Passover

Twelve children, representing the twelve disciples, drank "wine" (Ribena) and unleavened bread (crackers) to act out the Last Supper. They tasted a bitter herb dipped in salt water, for tears, to re-live the Passover meal when Jews remember their bitter lives in Egypt. One disciple, Judas, left early to betray Jesus to the authorities.

At the end of the meal eleven disciples went to a garden to pray where the two soldiers arrested Jesus.





It was the last Victorian Church to be built in Radnorshire. Half the churchyard still belongs to the diocese and is maintained by the stalwart volunteers of the conservation charity Caring for God's Acre, who also maintain the half belonging to the present residents.

St Peter's, Crug-y-Byddar

St Peter's, built in 1856-8, was the last Victorian church to be built in Radnorshire. The architect was Henry Lote, a name one finds dotted around our area. A school was also built next door. The prime-mover was the vicar of Beguildy, Abraham Thomas. At that time the far end of the Teme Valley was a little hive of milling industry and the population needed a church nearby. Rev Thomas put his heart into the project, witness that he is buried at the east end of the church.

Crug-y-Byddar was much loved, but as the population declined, it closed around 2003. It was bought by private individuals who converted it sympathetically into a home. The baptismal font has pride of place in the porch;

the graffiti etched into the stonework by the naughty boys of Crug-y-Byddar remains. Sadly, all of the chapels in Felindre and Crug-y-Byddar have been closed, though their burial grounds remain.

St Peter's continues to have a lovely old churchyard, famous for its orchids, in front of the church. That section with local graves remains in the care of the local church and is managed by "Caring for God's Acre" with scything and hedge trimming. As a result, the orchids – common spotted, heath spotted and the occasional twayblade – continue to grow in abundance, and are a delight to behold.

3rd – 11th June - Communities will Count Wildlife in 'Undisturbed' Churchyards

Parishes across England and Wales are registered to participate in Churches Count on Nature, an annual scheme where people visit churchyards and record the plant and animal species they encounter.

The biodiversity survey, supported by environmental charities A Rocha UK and Caring for God's Acre, as well as the Church of England and the Church in Wales, will take place from 3rd to 11th of June this year. In the last two years, 900 counting events took place across churches in England and Wales, and over 27,000 wildlife records were submitted. Churches across all denominations take part in the count each year.

The data will be used to determine where rare and endangered species are located in the country, and also to aid churches of all denominations to increase biodiversity on their land. This year, species on some of the 17,500 acres of churchyards in England alone will be mapped, with a further 1,282 acres of churchyards in Wales.

As graveyards and church land are usually undisturbed, they can be host to a great variety of wildlife not seen in other green spaces. Old churchyards often have fantastic flowery and species-rich grasslands. Could your church take part in this?





#LearnFromME

For 2023 we're focusing on the key aspect of ME that everyone should know about: that pushing harder can make you sicker. The technical term for this is post-exertional malaise (PEM).

Post-exertional malaise (PEM) is something that everyone with ME experiences.

It is a worsening of symptoms after physical, mental, or emotional exertion that would not have caused a problem before the illness and is the hallmark symptom of ME. For some patients, sensory overload (light and sound) can induce PEM. PEM intensifies the severity of symptoms and may last days, weeks, or permanently. The symptoms typically begin to worsen 12 to 48 hours after the activity or exposure.


Llanfair Waterdine WI





On 20th May in Knighton Community Hall, it is the County Show and it is always good to see what is being achieved by WI members.



At our April meeting, Andy Holman from Bleddfa spoke about the work that was undertaken there to renew the Elan Valley pipeline. In 1892 an Act of Parliament was passed, permitting the purchase of land in mid-Wales to lay a pipeline that would bring a reliable water supply to Birmingham, which has no major river running through it. Work started in 1893 and was completed in 1904, opened officially by King Edward VII and Queen Alexandra.

An amazing feat of engineering, the pipe only required a total fall of 172 feet from mid-Wales to Birmingham. It was dug by hand, effectively making an underground canal which was lined with heavy bricks to contain the pipe. The exact route of the pipeline is secret as it would be a prime terrorist target. In June 1942 the small dam constructed for the village of Elan was used to test bombs for the dambuster raids of the following year.

The renewal work in Bleddfa was undertaken on Andy's farm and involved constructing a bypass for a section of the pipe that was considered weak. A huge wall of earth was built to make a flat area of the sloping field. A track was laid for a small train to remove soil, and the labourers worked 12 hour shifts for 12 days, with one day off. Andy showed some intriguing photos, including the kayak that he used to canoe through the tunnel before it was filled in. He was delighted to note that there was no impact on local wildlife – the barn owls that lived in a nearby hollow oak tree did not move!

A Touching Story from China, found on my brother's Facebook page

All across China, people are talking about Dr Li Wen Liang. He was the doctor who discovered the novel coronavirus and in the early morning of 7 Feb, 2:58AM, he was promoted into glory and went home to be with our Father in heaven.



Back in December last year (2019), he was arrested for being a whistle blower 'spreading rumors' about a mysterious pneumonia like virus. This morning we found out he was in fact a fellow brother in Christ. Our hearts are deeply moved by his sacrificial choice to spread awareness about the virus despite the risks he faced, especially to his reputation and to his own health.

He continued to care for patients up until he was infected himself. What a legacy to leave behind of what it means to be like Jesus to those hurting in a time of crisis.

He chose to be an example of Immanuel, 'God with us' to the people of Wuhan. Can you imagine the joy he must have felt as he entered into eternity and heard the words, "Well done, my good and faithful servant"?

So today, please pray for his family, especially his wife who is also infected and 8 months pregnant with their second child. May God heal them supernaturally and give them grace, peace, strength and comfort during this time.

Dr Li Wen Liang penned a deeply touching Chinese poem below of how he would miss his family, his beloved Wuhan and quoted 2 Tim 4:7-8 'I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith'. Finally, there is laid up for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous Judge, will give to me on that Day, and not to me only but also to all who have loved His appearing.

The Hero who Told the Truth

"I don't want to be a hero.
I still have my parents,
And my children,
And my pregnant wife who's about to give birth,

And many of my patients in the ward. Though my integrity cannot be exchanged for the goodness of others,
