

The February cover is a modern version of the 'Presentation in the Temple' celebrated on 2nd February. Luke tells the story of Mary and Joseph taking their infant Jesus to the Temple to be blessed. Simeon, an old man with grey hair and beard, receives the child. His tall hat denotes that he is a prophet, as long ago it was promised that before he died, he would see the Messiah. He has waited his whole life for the fulfilment of that promise. Here Jesus is more of a young boy than a baby, being held by Simeon. His divinity is signed by a halo, and he blesses us with his upraised finger.

The stained glass is from the Cathedral church in Beaune, France, in Burgundy.

The 'Presentation in the Temple' is also called 'Candlemas' because Simeon famously declared that Jesus was "A light to lighten the Gentiles, and the glory of thy people Israel", and so the Church has traditionally blessed candles on this day.

Our thoughts are with Do Phillips and family, mourning the loss of nephew Paul Walker, who recently passed away aged 67 years.





Celtic Saint of the Month

Caedmon – Herdsman and Poet – Died 11th February c.680

You may well ask why a Northumbrian with an Anglo-Saxon name is our Celtic saint for February. Caedmon worked as a herdsman in the double monastery of Streonaeshalch, which later became known as Whitby Abbey, run by Abbess



Hild on Celtic lines. Caedmon himself may have been a Celtic Briton, living alongside the conquering Angles. It looks as if his name is an anglicisation of the Welsh Cadfan.

Anyway, it seems that they used to have feasts and the harp was past round for everyone to take a turn to sing. When Caedmon saw the harp approaching, he would make an excuse and disappear out to the barn. He was no good at playing or singing. One night he went out to see to the animals in the barn and then fell asleep. He had a dream in which someone said, "Caedmon, sing some song to me." "I cannot sing," he answered, "and for that reason I left the feast and came hither, because I could not sing." He who talked with him answered, "However that may be, you shall sing to me." "What shall I sing?" rejoined Caedmon. "Sing the beginning of created things," said the other.

This is how the Venerable Bede recounts it in his *Ecclesiastical History* and goes on to say that Caedmon sang in the dream and he remembered the song when he woke and sang it to the steward, to Abbess Hild and then to other

learned men. They judged it was a divine gift and they taught Caedmon other Bible passages so that he could put them into wonderful verse. Hild instructed him to become a monk and he created songs praising God and covering the whole of the story of God's redemptive work.

Not only is this the only verse of Caedmon's that has survived, but it is also the earliest surviving Anglo-Saxon poem. Bede recorded it in Latin, but various scribes added Anglo-Saxon versions in the margins.

Here is the verse in modern English:

Now must we honour the kingdom of heaven's guardian.

The measurer's might and his mind-plans.

The work of the glory father.

When he of each wonder, eternal Lord, established the beginning,

he first created for the children of men, heaven as a roof.

Holy creator.



Life on a spin

The Rev Dr Gary Bowness considers the aim of Lent.

Many years ago, at the Pleasure Beach at Blackpool, there was a certain 'ride' or amusement that was strictly for the physically fit. It consisted of a flat wooden disc about 20 feet in diameter and set at an angle of 45 degrees in the floor. When it began to rotate, the aim was to get to the centre where there was a pole. As the disc rotated faster and faster, everyone who failed to get to the pole got flung off. Nowadays there's probably a European Community regulation banning it as far too dangerous!

The principle of the game was a basic law of physics. When any wheel rotates, the outer rim moves fastest of all. Half way to the centre and you are moving a lot more slowly. And, at least theoretically, at the absolute centre will be a point which is totally still. That's why anyone who reached that pole could stand there quite comfortably.

We have just started the Church's season of Lent. It's generally thought of as being a time for giving up chocolate, wine, whatever. But it's really a time to remind us that in our own rapidly spinning world, God is the still centre.

All around God is motion, sound, change and decay – galaxies circling, seasons and years rotating, life developing and decaying. And at the still centre, where there is no variableness, is God, the same yesterday, today and forever.

Only about seven weeks ago Christians worldwide were thinking of God getting involved in a special way in the ever moving and changing life of the world. And one great characteristic of Jesus was His stillness. Busy, harassed, injured people found someone with neither clever chat nor idle gossip, neither vulgar boasting nor loud opinion. His life always seemed to rotate round a still central point, which gave Him balance and authority.

"Be still then and know that I am God" wrote the Psalmist. Lent is a time for us to try and do just that – to find the still centre of God in our own individual lives.

Of course, we're all of us very much in the world, and must live our lives in all of its busyness. But it may do none of us any harm to be a little more silent than we often are – quick to listen and slow to speak. And the more silent spaces we give ourselves, the more we'll give that still, small voice within each one of us the chance to be heard.





The Vestry Cupboard That Hid "Precious" Welsh Bible

A Bible printed in 1620, one of the very first to be produced in Welsh, has been discovered by chance in a vestry cupboard in St Martin and St Enfail's Church in Merthyr, near Carmarthen.

Mari James, Library Development Officer at St David's Cathedral, described the 400-year-old Bible as "quite a treasure" and "a precious part of Wales' history of Christian worship".

A former Merthyr churchwarden, Huw Evans, found the Bible forgotten and unrecognised among candles, communion wine and linen in the back of the cupboard.

Copies of the Bible, known as the Bishop Parry version, were distributed to all churches in Wales to comply with Queen Elizabeth I's instruction that everyone should be able to read the Scriptures in their own language. This was the main Reformation project in Wales, intended to consolidate Protestantism.

The volume was based on the 1588 translation by Bishop William Morgan. The Old Testament was translated directly from the original Hebrew, and the New Testament from Greek. Some of the work was carried out in St David's.

A Welsh Book of Common Prayer, dating from 1710 in the reign of Queen Anne, was also found languishing - in the same vestry cupboard.

Menna played the harp and sang "Mary's Boy Child" with the children, helped by mums joining in as all gathered around the crib.


Menna and Caroline also sang "In the Bleak Mid -Winter" and George Baker, our organist, entertained with a "European Tour of Carols."

13st February - Shrove Tuesday, Pancake Day

Ever wonder why we eat pancakes just before Lent? The tradition dates back to Anglo-Saxon times, when Christians spent Lent in repentance and severe fasting.

So on the Tuesday before Ash Wednesday, the church bell would summon them to confession, where they would be 'shriven', or absolved from their sins, which gives us Shrove Tuesday. At home, they would then eat up their last eggs and fat, and making a pancake was the easiest way to do this. For the next 47 days, they pretty well starved themselves.


Pancakes feature in cookery books as far back as 1439, and today's pancake races are in remembrance of a panicked woman back in 1445 in Olney, Buckinghamshire. She was making pancakes when she heard the shriving bell calling her to confession. Afraid she'd be late, she ran to the church in a panic, still in her apron, and still holding the pan.

Flipping pancakes is also centuries old. A poem from Pasquil's Palin in 1619 runs: "And every man and maide doe take their turne, And tosse their Pancakes up for feare they burne."

Some people have noted that the ingredients of pancakes can be used to highlight four significant things about this time of year: eggs stand for creation, flour is the staff of life, while salt keeps things wholesome, and milk stands for purity.

Shrove Tuesday is always 47 days before Easter Sunday and falls between 3rd February and 9th March.


