



### Easter at the Cathedral

**Holy Week** at Brecon Cathedral was very special with daily events, many of them unique to Holy Week. A highlight was always the excellent Cathedral choir, including young children, led by James Davies.

**PALM SUNDAY:** On a bright spring morning, clergy, congregation and a visiting chamber choir from Imperial College, London, led us in "All Glory, Laud and Honour" as we processed through the lychgate and into the Cathedral. Large palm plants graced the Cathedral, and we held palm crosses blessed at an early morning service. Beams of sunlight and clouds of incense marked the occasion in the Cathedral.

**CHRISM EUCHARIST TUESDAY:** Bishop John led a Cathedral filled with clergy and parishioners from around the Diocese. He blessed Chrism Oils for anointing the sick and dying, for baptisms, for confirmations, ordinations and crowning of a sovereign. Priests use these oils to mark a cross on the forehead of recipients. The whole congregation, deacons and priests renewed their vows "to dedicate [themselves] afresh to his service as stewards of the mysteries of God."



**WEEKDAY COMMUNIONS:** On Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday evenings a quiet communion with an address was offered in the Laurence Chapel, a side chapel at the Cathedral.

MAUNDY THURSDAY: Clergy washed the feet of parishioners to commemorate the anniversary of Jesus celebrating Passover with his disciples. Then we received Communion with the words of Jesus: "This is my body broken for you". Afterwards clergy carried reserved Communion solemnly through the cathedral, preceded by the thurifer swinging incense. Lights were dimmed as we joined them to process to the Keynes Chapel where the sacrament was reverently placed. Some sat in private prayer and contemplation while the main altar was stripped of its furnishings. We departed in darkness.



**GOOD FRIDAY:** We arrived to a bare Cathedral without any palms or decorations. A cross, totally veiled in red, stood at the front. Individual voices in the choir sang the Passion Gospel from John 19, a moving tale of Christ's suffering. Even communion was stripped down, as we only received reserved bread. The cross was unveiled and most of the congregation came forward to reverence it. It was moved to the altar and draped with a red scarf. We left in silence.

**EASTER EVE:** Paschal Ceremonies and Festal Eucharist. After dark we met outside the Cathedral by a roaring brazier. The Dean put the 5 marks of Christ's sufferings on the big Paschal (Easter) Candle to represent wounds in 2 hands, 2 feet, and 1 side. The candle was lit from the brazier and processed through a dark cathedral with the repeated chant "The Light of Christ" and our response "Thanks be to God". The Cathedral remained in darkness, except for our individual candles, for lessons and choral anthems. When lights were switched on, we renewed our baptismal vows from the font and were sprinkled with holy water, before celebrating communion. The final prayer summarizes the evening: "Heavenly Father, you have delivered us from the power of darkness, and brought us into the kingdom of your Son."

**EASTER DAY:** Bishop John led our festival service, starting with blessing the Easter Garden. In his address he considered the Seven Wonders of the World (wonders like the Pyramids or the Great Wall of China). But he offered instead a student's new list: (1) Sight (2) Hearing (3) Touch (4) Feeling (5) Laughter (6) Tears (7) Love. These are 'Wonders' to be experienced daily. We renewed our Baptism Promises ("I believe and trust in him") and our smiling Bishop walked down the aisle sprinkling us all with holy water – a magic moment. Musicians (strings, piano, bassoon) joined the choir for anthems and Easter hymns at our festive eucharist.

## Llangunllo WI and Friends Take to the Floor

Our April meeting was great fun and saw 17 members and friends take to the floor in the village hall to have a go at line dancing. Our teacher for the evening was Debby Amer, who took us through the origins and history of line dancing, which was very interesting, before she set about teaching us a number of steps that formed increasingly more complicated dances.

There were lots of laughs during the hour, and the level of concentration was clearly visible on faces as the group tried to remember the steps, whether it was to the left or right, let alone putting it all together into the dances. Needless to say, some were much better than others!! But everyone got there in the end, and as an observer I have to say they looked very impressive.

After all that concentration and exercise it was time to enjoy a lovely supper, a glass or two and a catch up before we had our business meeting, where we had an update on our up and coming programme, and what our WI will be doing to raise the awareness of the state of our own local river.

Six members of Llangunllo WI (river swimmers and citizen scientist water monitors) have sent a letter to Peter Perry, CEO of Welsh Water, regarding Welsh Water data showing that in 2022, the sewer storm overflow in Llangunllo spilled 79 times for a total of 1522.25 hours - amongst the top 5% worst offenders in Wales. He has put us in touch with Steve Wilson, MD of the Waste Water business and we are eagerly awaiting his response.

Meanwhile members are preparing for action over the BIG RIVER WATCH weekend, 3rd-6th May. There will be a popup exhibition about the Lugg in the village phone box, plus rivery wildlife activities and a chance to meet a citizen scientist water monitor in the Community Garden. More events are planned: see Chatterbrook WI's river map and meet a monitor at the Norton Hub on Bank Holiday Monday 6th May and expect some fun activities from Radnorshire Wildlife Trust's Pentwyn reserve.

But most importantly please take part in the BIG RIVER WATCH yourself. In just 15 minutes you can join people from across the country taking a good look at their local rivers. Download the app or print out the form from theriverstrust.org/take-action/the-big-river-watch



## **About the Cover – Wind of the Holy Spirit**

On Sunday 19th May we celebrate Pentecost, 50 days after Easter. On that day the Holy Spirit arrived to fill the early disciples with power: "a sound like the blowing of a violent wind" and "tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them." [Acts 2.2-4] In this cover image a man is reading from a great Bible (perhaps a Welsh Bible) as an enveloping wind engulfs them. Such is the power of God's Word.

The Holy Spirit is often portrayed as a dove alighting on a holy person (like Jesus at his baptism), but here the artist, Tom Denny, chooses instead to show the Spirit as wind. If you are familiar with the tiny Traherne Chapel in Hereford Cathedral, you will recognise his style.

## Celtic Saint of the Month - St Brioc - 1st May - died c. 502



Brioc is another of our wandering saints you may never have heard of. He travelled from Wales to Cornwall and on to Brittany and may also have visited Scotland. Because of his travels, his name is spelled in several different ways, among them: Breton: Brieg; Welsh: Briog; Cornish: Breock; French: Brieuc; and the annual St Bruix Fair is held on the Isle of Bute in Scotland, where there is a church in Rothesay dedicated to him. He may have been of Irish extraction like Brynach and Brychan, but he was born in Ceredigion. His parents, Cerp and Eldruda, at first named him Briafael (St Briavels in the Forest of Dean is named after him), but they were persuaded to change it to the pet name Brioc. They sent him to Paris to be fostered and educated by St Germanus of Auxerre. He was eventually ordained and, at the age of twenty-five, returned to Ceredigion, to help with the spreading of the Gospel in his home country. His monastic foundation was probably at Llandyfriog, where the church was originally dedicated to him.

Brioc is known as one of the Seven Founding Saints of Brittany. It seems he had intended to sail to Italy with 168 followers, but the journey was rough and they landed near

Padstow on the Cornish coast. Nearby is the village of St Breock, named after him. Evidently, he converted the local king Conan and his court before setting sail again. This time they landed at Finistère in Brittany and, travelling up the river, they founded a monastery at Tréguier. Brioc didn't stay long as he heard there was a pestilence in Wales.

He left the monastery in the hands of his nephew Tudwal and went home to help.

Later he returned to Brittany with 84 companions. They landed at the mouth of the river Gouet. The local king Riwal was not happy with these strangers arriving in his kingdom, but when he met Brioc he realised they were cousins. Riwal gave Brioc and his companions his own palace and estate and moved his court to another village. Brioc's followers slowly built the great monastery of Saint-Brieuc-des-Vaux.

St Brioc is often depicted with wolves. Evidently in old age he was travelling in a cart, his companions walking alongside, when they were suddenly surrounded by a pack of wolves. His companions ran away, but Brioc tamed the wolves with the sign of the cross and they all knelt as if praying. Brioc died on 1st May, some time in the first decade of the 6th century. In honour of his connections with Brittany and Ceredigion, Aberystwyth is now twinned with Saint-Brieuc-des-Vaux and there is a road named Boulevard St Brieuc in the town. In Saint-Brieuc there is a roundabout named Aberystwyth Roundabout.

# Improving Village Access to Llangunllo Railway Station - January 1918

At a meeting of Llangunllo Parish Council, held in the school room, it was proposed by Mr W West (the Village Shop) and seconded by Mr E Morgan that the path on Beacon Dingle, leading to the Railway Station, be sided and gravelled.

In 1865 the Heart of Wales Railway Line, historically known as the Central Wales Line (Rheilfford Canol Cymru) was extended from Knighton to Llandrindod Wells. On this section of the line, within the Ministry Area, are two feats of Victorian engineering, the viaduct at Knucklas, designated a Grade 2 listed structure in 1985 and Llancoch Tunnel, near Llangunllo Station.

The route chosen by the railway company left Llangunllo Station 1.4 miles north of the village. The Beacon Dingle pathway is a "shorter cut" from the village to the station, but not without a steep descent on one side and steep ascent on the other. The gateway to access the pathway is on the left from the Four Ashes Crossroads on the Llangunllo to Dolyfelin road. In the days when people walked to catch the train and goods and livestock moved via the railway, the path was certainly well used by the local community.

The photograph shows the work, as recommended by the Parish Council, underway.

Over the past 18 months lots of work has gone on to give the pub some love and prepare the way for this Share Offer. Many members of the community have been involved in tidying and stripping out the building, maintaining its current state and preventing further deterioration, alongside establishing the Community Benefit Society, with all the background work that that entails, and submitting grant applications.

## The Flower Arranger's Garden

For the flower arranger May is a difficult month, with a limited choice of flowers in the garden, although the beauty of the limey green foliage bursting through kick starts the imagination. New foliage is very tempting, but is soft and quite unreliable in water. It is best to stick to the evergreens for a little longer.

Everyone has a favourite month in the garden. According to a recent poll, May is the best. Tulips planted in late autumn are now at their peak, many deliciously streaked and flecked in contrasting colours, ranging from white, yellow and rose through to red, purple and near black. The North of England Tulip Society hold their annual show in May, with hundreds of varieties and colours on display, the results of many years of breeding, all of the exhibitors with an obsession for tulips and hoping their exhibit will cause a buzz in the hall. I am told that, over past centuries, the breeding of this exquisite flower was male dominated, but not any more! Whole families now get involved.

As the garden warms up, the scent of hyacinths seems to dominate. The small, but equally pretty, blue and white grape hyacinth is a real delight. The sound of the honey bees visiting them is a real bonus. If you have a shady corner, I am sure you will soon see the nodding white bells of the dainty lily of the valley and be aware of its perfume. The heavy blossom of lilac and the magnificent magnolia tree will soon be making a splendid point of interest in the garden, and the profuse Clematis montana will be spreading its froth of pink and white flowers, covering walls, trellises and pergolas. Spring flowering clematis have rather smaller and more delicate flowers than their late summer cousins, bur you are rewarded with the fragrance. Several varieties follow with an equally impressive display of silky, fluffy seedheads. These are well worth growing for your dried arrangements later in the year.

This month is time to think about tubs and pots on the patio, with so much choice now in the garden centres. Containers give great scope for taking the principles of flower arranging outside, arranging shapes, colours and foliage together. May is the month to get the main planting done, together with lawns needing attention, lifting and moving snowdrops, deadheading daffodils; and be aware of the chance of overnight frosts: new plants will need protecting.

Here is an excerpt from one poem, that reminds us that weather has never given up plaguing us!


### The "Dredful Flud"







## Welsh Hymns 3 - Calon Lân

Nid wy'n gofyn bywyd moethus, Aur y byd na'i berlau mân: Gofyn wyf am galon hapus, Calon onest, calon lân.

Calon lân yn llawn daioni Tecach yw na'r lili dlos: Dim ond calon lân all ganu, Canu'r dydd a chanu'r nos.

Hwyr a bore fy nymuniad Gwyd i'r nef ar adain cân Ar i Dduw, er mwyn fy Ngheidwad, Roddi i mi galon lân. I don't ask for a luxurious life, The world's gold or its fine pearls: I ask for a happy heart, An honest heart, a pure heart.

A pure heart full of goodness
Is fairer than the pretty lily:
None but a pure heart can sing,
Sing in the day and sing in the night.

Evening and morning, my wish Rising to heaven on the wing of song, For God, for the sake of my Saviour, To give me a pure heart.



Daniel James

Calon Lân (a Pure Heart) is an extremely popular and widely sung hymn in Wales, at rugby matches, weddings and funerals. The life of Daniel James takes us down some corners of Welsh working-class history.

Many Welsh hymns were written by non-conformist ministers; Daniel James is one exception. Born near Swansea in 1848, he led a very hard life as a worker in steel and tinplate, moving to the Welsh Valleys to work as a miner. His first marriage to Ann ended with her death and he was left to care for five children. He then married Gwenllian, a widow with five further children whose husband had died in Ukraine. He had been working there in a town called Hughesovska, where many Welsh workers had migrated. Daniel and Gwenllian went on to have another three children before her premature death in 1895.

Despite having to leave school at the age of fourteen, Daniel had help in developing his talent for poetry at his chapel, Mynyddbach and adopted the bardic name Gwyrosydd, meaning 'Man of the Moors'. In later life, he wrote poetry for friends in exchange for a pint. He was described as the 'bad boy of Mynyddbach', as temperance was the expected behaviour. *Calon Lân* was allegedly composed on the back of a cigarette packet whilst he was working at the pit in Blaengarw, a mining village high above Bridgend. Daniel was getting too old to continue to work underground and was able to secure a job with

the local council as a gravedigger.

Daniel maintained his deep faith, demonstrated vividly in this hymn. His poetry, though published in his lifetime, is less well known. *Calon Lân* is usually sung to a tune composed for it by John Hughes, a manager at the Duffryn tinplate works in Morriston. The depth of cultural relevance of *Calon Lân* is shown by a modern version by the musician Ryland Teifi: *Lili'r Nos (Lily of the Night)*. It won the 2006 Can i Gymru / Song for Wales competition.


## Teme Valley Gardeners' Club
