### **Bleddfa Shop and Post Office**

The earliest record found of a shop operating in Bleddfa is in the 1861 census where Sarah Davies, widow is recorded having an occupation as a grocer.

In the 1871, 1881 and 1891 census George Lloyd Powell, Tailor and Grocer, is recorded living in the property now known as the Old Post Office with his family.

The Post Office was originally established 16 July 1881 and set up under the Post Town of Knighton. In 1884 the administration of Bleddfa was transferred to the Railway substation of Llangunllo. Bleddfa received its own rubber stamp in 1895.

The 1901 census shows George Lloyd Powell (60) Tailor, Martha Powell (56) Sub Post Mistress, Albert Powell (26) Tailor and Postman and Rosalind Powell (22) Post office Assistant living at the shop.

In the early 1900s, Mr and Mrs Hardwick moved to the Post Office from Cascob with their children Joel and Eva. Joel, who had served his apprenticeship as a grocer with Hamels in Knighton, took over the Post Office, with his sister Eva taking charge of the shop in his absence. When Eva left to get married, Joel married Janie and they ran the shop side by side until they retired at the end of 1948 when the shop was sold to Mr & Mrs JC Benbow.


The Benbows sold to Mr H Dean on 16th September 1950. They in turn sold to Mr and Mrs M Casson on 31st October 1955

Ruth Casson ran the shop and post office until Jean Thomas, Ruth's daughter took over as postmistress on 1st October 1988 and continued to run the "short shop", a shop for when people ran short. Fresh bread and cakes were delivered to the shop every day and papers at the weekend. Travelling salesmen would deliver cigarettes (Players) and ice-cream.

The Post Office was closed temporarily in 2006 when Jean became ill. Jean died in November 2007 and the Post Office closed its doors forever a year afterwards.

Albert Thomas, Jean's husband, remembers when he was left in charge for the day. A lovely young couple came in with 2 half pint bottles and 2 one pint stone bottles of brown ale they'd won at a local fete. They didn't drink so asked if they could trade them for lemonade. Albert gave them a couple of bottles. A while later he took one of the bottles out to the back and enjoyed a beer. He decided to have another and discovered the remaining 3 bottles contained water! On close examination he found the tops had been tampered with and one of the bottles had the wrong top altogether.

After Ruth's death in 1992 the post office and house were unoccupied for a couple of years. Albert woke one morning to find the back door to the property had been forced and that the safe, an axe and £113.00 had been stolen. The police were called and informed that there had also been strychnine (for killing moles) in the safe, which was a cause for concern. The safe was found at Beggar's Bush with the back smashed in and the contents taken. The culprits were never apprehended but there was a gang operating in the area and a few other post offices had also been targeted. The incident was reported in the Brecon & Radnor Times.

The shop had a petrol pump outside, operated by a hand pump. The maximum sale that could be made from the pump was 3s 6 ½d. They sold Esso (put a Tiger in your tank!) and sold tiger tails in the shop for one shilling each. Graham George was the last person ever to buy petrol from the pump 3rd October 1980.

Arthur Joseph was the local postman who lived at Lower Hivron. When the post van came from Knighton to collect and deliver post they would call by and put Arthur and his BMA bike in the back and give him a lift to Bleddfa, getting there for 7.30am. They would have a cup of tea and chat in the back whilst Ruth sorted the post, then Arthur would deliver round the parish.

### About the Cover - Harvest, The Plough

This traditional Harvest image is from the Plough Chapel in Brecon. The mountains of Cribbin, Corndu, and Pen-y-fan stand behind the farmer who determinedly works his fields with oxen and plough. Fittingly a couple of leaves and flowers from a recent flower festival appear in the photo. At harvest tide the scene tugs at our hearts. It represents an earlier time, but one that is still within living memory for some, a simpler way of farming. The Plough Chapel, built in the 1890s, grew from its former life as an inn of the same name. It is one of the finest chapel interiors with beautiful curved oak pews raked upwards and two staircases leading to either side of a pulpit carved richly with roses and lilies.



Our speaker was David Weller, local beekeeper, who told us about his hobby. Bees have been in existence for 30 million years, and honey was used by the Egyptians as currency. Honey found in Tutankhamun's tomb when it was opened years after his burial, was apparently still viable.

The sole purpose of the drones is to mate with the queen who can lay up to 2,500 eggs per day. These eggs are looked after by the worker bees who travel up to 3 miles to find pollen and nectar. One bee makes one twelfth of a teaspoon of honey in its lifetime! David passed round a sample of his honey for us to taste and it was delicious!





### **Knighton Festival 2024**

The Knighton Festival of Books, Art and Music celebrates its seventh year in October with a programme of interesting and thought provoking talks, all held at the Knighton Community Centre from **11-13 October**. Over the course of the weekend there will be authors' talks, advice for aspiring writers, a film, an art and book fair and some live theatre too.

The Festival begins with a poetry themed afternoon featuring three outstanding poets: Grahame Davies, Nicholas Murray and John Barnie who will read from and discuss their recent collections. In the evening Flicks in the Sticks will be showing the film *Bright Star*, starring Ben Wishaw as John Keats in a portrayal of the thwarted romance between the poet and his neighbour Fanny Brawne.

On Saturday 12th October there is a full day of talks on a wide range of topics including Monica Macias' fascinating memoir of growing up in North Korea; and Ariane Bankes' account of the charismatic and devastatingly beautiful Paget sisters who overcame a meagre education to take 1930s London society by storm in the 1930s. Jem Poster and Sarah Burton dispense advice on writing and discuss their new Victorian detective novel *Eliza Mace*. Fiona Sampson explores the meaning of place, how we shape it and how it shapes us in *Limestone Country*, while Joe St Clair addresses the subject of spirituality at a time of huge global upheaval, change and uncertainty in *Transcendence*.

On Sunday, astronomer Martin Griffiths, the director of the Brecon Beacons Observatory examines the Celtic night sky in his guide to astronomy and its links to the ancient mythologies of the Welsh peoples. Stand-up comedian turned novelist Ian Moore will be talking about his hilarious series of murder mysteries set in the Loire Valley. The Festival ends with a performance of *Twelfth Night* by the Willow Globe Theatre group.

The Festival is sponsored by Knighton Town Council, Knighton Community Centre, Literature Wales, and Knighton Rotary Club. There is a small charge of £5 for most of the talks, and a discounted weekend ticket available at £25. Admission fees for the film and the play are not included in the weekend ticket.

More information about the Festival programme and all our speakers, together with booking details can be found on the website *knightonfestival.wales*. Tickets for all the talks can be purchased on the Eventbrite website.



### Celtic Saint of the Month St Triduana – 8th October (4th-8th Century)

Triduana is the Latin version of her name, the name she is remembered by in Restalrig, a village that is now in the middle of Edinburgh. The ancient church there was rebuilt and dedicated to St Margaret, but in the churchyard is St Triduana's Aisle. This is a twostorey hexagonal building, which was restored at the beginning of the last century. The top half had been completely destroyed at the beginning of the Reformation, as the veneration of Triduana was so strong, even in the 16th century. In 1906 the rubble was cleared from the bottom half, which was partly below ground level. It had been used as a burial vault, but they found that it was actually a wellhouse and contained Triduana's holy well. She was so popular for centuries as it was believed she could heal blindness and other eye conditions. The legend is that Nechtan, King of the Picts, had fallen in love with her on account of her beautiful eyes. So she plucked out her eyes and sent them to him, attached to a thorn branch. This is when she lived in Rescobie near Forfar in Angus, but later she moved to Restalrig, where she eventually died and was buried. By the way, there was more than one King Nechtan in Pictish times, which is why we don't know which century Triduana actually lived in.






Triduana was known by other names in local languages, especially in the far north of Scotland, On Papa Westr

Scotland. On Papa Westray, one of the Orkney islands, there is a small island in St Tredwell's Loch, where there are the ruins of an ancient chapel dedicated to her. It was a very popular pilgrimage destination, especially for those with eye diseases. They would walk around the loch and then bathe their eyes in the water beside the chapel and their eyes would be healed. The local Presbyterian minister was not happy and tried to stop them from such idolatry.

A chapel near Brora in Sutherland bears her name as St Trolla on the Kintradwell estate.

The Norse version of her name was Trollhaena and there is an account in the Orkneyinga Saga about Bishop John of Scrabster in Caithness. He had disobeyed Earl Harald who decreed that he should be blinded and his tongue cut out. Bishop John prayed to St Trollhaena and was carried to her "resting place" where his sight and speech were restored. It is thought that the "resting place" might have been the chapel at Ballachly, not far from Scrabster. In the midst of the moor is an overgrown burial ground on the site of Triduana's medieval chapel. The adjoining farmland used to be known as Croit Trolla, the croft of St Trollhaena.



So these are the traces of a mysterious pious lady who caught the imagination of medieval believers, but even today she is not forgotten. The modern Catholic church in Restalrig is still dedicated to St Ninian and St Triduana.



### Llanfair Waterdine Bike Show 2024

On Sunday 4th August we held a Classic Bike Show at Llanfair Waterdine. This was put on to raise funds for BloodBikes Wales.

The first thing I have to do is give a huge thank you to the people of Llanfair Waterdine and surrounding area for putting up with us. Not only do they put up with us but the help and cooperation from the village has to be seen to be believed, it's like the whole village and valley turn out and want to do something towards making the event a success.

I have to thank so many people and I'm sorry if you don't get a mention. The people that make the homemade cakes that appear still warm, Pauline, Julie and the team serving the cakes, tea and coffee, Elaine for washing up (although she makes me do it at home), Abbie and her friend selling raffle tickets, Rob Gwilt for an absolutely amazing display on the history of the Graig scramble and once again thanks to one of the stars of the Graig Scramble Andy Roberton for judging the bikes. Steve, Matt and the lads who are putting on this weekend's fun day at the same venue and have been a big help, Steve and Donna for publicising the event far and wide, Rose for making the fantastic posters, Dean and his wife for their help, Jenny and Jane for doing the banging burgers with Fred doing the cooking, Pete, Clive and Marion parking and gate duties, Sue walking miles to catch all the entries ready for judging as well as the Classic Car folks and the Salop VMCC for joining us and a big thanks to John Cadwallader for bringing the London to Sydney rally car. A special thank you has to go to Robert and Ruth for allowing us to use their field for parking as I don't know what we would have done without it.

Anyway, just a quick word about BloodBikes Wales for people that aren't aware of what we do. BloodBikes Wales is a 100% volunteer charity which provides a completely free courier service to the NHS, delivering blood, samples, plasma, donated human milk, documents and other items anywhere that's needed. There are no Government grants or funding of any description and it is funded purely by donations and events like this show. We are very busy locally and have six volunteer riders within the Knighton area. We operate mainly in Wales but a lot of our daytime jobs involve picking up urgent medications from Hereford Hospital which we deliver direct to patients houses. Most of our work involves pathology samples which have to be taken to the larger hospitals for testing, this is very often out of hours of NHS transport. The very urgent jobs would have been taken by police car or ambulance but we can now cover that which frees them up for the roles they need to carry out. We also carry human milk which is picked up from donors' houses and taken to either Chester or Swansea for screening and then we will transport it to whichever hospital it is needed. Locally we operate from 9am until 10pm seven days a week, 365 days a year. Although we are the Powys BloodBikes Area we travel anywhere and very often go to Cardiff, Newport, Cwmbran, Machynlleth, Shrewsbury as well as the local hospitals. So if you see a BloodBike in Hereford, Shrewsbury or anywhere local just give them a wave as it will probably be one of our boys and I'm sure they will appreciate it.

Back to the show. This year's show was a tremendous success and as of today this show and the people of Llanfair have made  $\pounds$ 5057.14 for BloodBikes. Every single penny of this will go to running the bikes, nobody in the charity takes a wage, there are no fancy offices, it is just run from people's homes and it's all voluntary right up to the Chairman. We as riders often get thanked for what we do but this is a collective effort, every person that paid £5 to get in, bought a burger for £3, made a cake or made a donation is part of the team that allows BloodBikes to work so thank you.

I could not finish without thanking the main man Dave Barrett. Without Dave this event would not run, fact, there are always willing helpers but it needs somebody to drive it and that someone is Dave. Thanks Dave.



#### The story behind... Come Ye Thankful People Come

Come, ye thankful people, come, Raise the song of harvest home! All is safely gathered in, Ere the winter storms begin; God, our maker, doth provide For our wants to be supplied; Come to God's own temple, come; Raise the song of harvest home!

We ourselves are God's own field, Fruit unto his praise to yield; Wheat and tares together sown, Unto joy or sorrow grown; First the blade and then the ear, Then the full corn shall appear: Grant, O harvest Lord, that we Wholesome grain and pure may be....

By H Alford (1810 - 71)

Very probably, you will sing this well-loved Harvest hymn this month. It was written by the Revd Henry Aldford DD, a Victorian clergyman who had been a fellow student at Trinity College, Cambridge with Alfred Lord Tennyson, and whose transparent goodness and friendliness seem to have made him liked and appreciated wherever he went.

His ministry began as Vicar of Wymeswold, a tiny village in Leicestershire with a badly neglected church. Over 18 years, Henry rebuilt the faltering Christian community, faithfully visiting every person in his parish, and preaching his way through the Bible in sermons that were so clear that everyone could understand him. He then moved on to the incumbency of Quebec Chapel in London for four years, before moving to the Deanery of Canterbury, in 1857, where he lived until his death in early 1871.

Henry was one of life's good people; gentle, kindly, grateful for everything he had (he used to say 'grace' before AND after each meal), and eager to encourage all those whom he served. He was prodigiously productive: writing something like 50 books. The best known of these was a four-volume exposition of the New Testament, which took him nearly 20 years.

His famous hymn draws upon two of Jesus' parables: the story of the wheat and tares (Mt 13:24-30) and also the story of the seed that grows unbeknown to the sower (Mark 4:26-29). Both are parables drawn from agriculture; both are about the ultimate harvest of our souls before God. During this lifetime we properly give thanks to God for our harvest of His gifts of creation, but we should also reflect on what seed we are sowing in our lives, and what harvest we may expect; as one day God will gather together *only His own* for the eternal heavenly harvest.





### **Types of Anglican Church Services in ERMA**

#### MP - Morning Prayer

A service of morning prayer either CinW Contemporary or Book of Common Prayer (BCP)

#### MW - Morning Worship

A less formal service based on MP

#### **EP** - Evening Prayer

A service of evening prayer either CinW Contemporary or Book of Common prayer (BCP)

Morning or Evening Worship/Praise - A less formal service. Sometimes with a theme eg harvest.

#### Compline - A short Night Office

Set readings and prayers for night time.

Compline Plus - A service of hymns and reflection based around the liturgy of Compline.

Holy Communion/Eucharist - A service that includes the sharing of bread and wine as directed by Jesus at the Last Supper. This can be with hymns or said without hymns. The Liturgy will be CinW 2004, BCP or occasional Celtic.


